Graduate Outcomes 2020/21

Full-time UK domiciled first degree graduates - 15 months after Bath

The University of Bath has an excellent record of graduate employment, featuring in the top ten for graduate prospects in three major national league tables*. Across all subjects, 92% of Bath 2020/21 graduates who are employed in the UK are in high skilled employment, compared to 74% nationally*. Hundreds of employers of all sizes and from all industries each year advertise vacancies, deliver presentations or network with our students; we are in the top 15 universities targeted by employers[†].

The information shown here is from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Graduate Outcomes survey for 2020/21 leavers. It is the biggest UK annual social survey and captures the perspectives and current status of recent graduates, 15 months after leaving university.

Studies within Business Administration covers a broad-based training in core business areas which opens diverse career opportunities in accounting, finance, marketing, management and human resources. Graduates from these courses develop many skills that make them attractive to prospective employers, including teamwork, communication, analytical and problem-solving skills, entrepreneurship skills as well as knowledge of specialist business principles. They often hold diverse roles in large national and multi-national companies.

Occupations and job titles

Business Administration graduates progress into various jobs within many business areas, such as management, marketing, sales, finance, data analysis, recruitment, consultancy, human resources and more. Graduates may also progress into other roles such as trader, strategy analyst and customer success analyst.

The vast majority of our UK employed Business Administration graduates are in high skilled employment.
