Some readers will be familiar with the modular doctorate programme offered by the Department of Education, which leads to the award of the degree of Doctor of Education (EdD) following successful completion of 4 units plus a Research Enquiry of around 40,000 words. One of the optional EdD units, entitled *International Education: philosophy and practice*, has been developed by CEIC colleagues and is running again on campus in June/July 2003. The 2002 unit included input from Jeff Thompson, Mike Fertig, Jim Cambridge, George Walker (IB Organization), Roger Brown (IB Research Unit), Keith Allen (St Clare's Oxford), Richard Pearce (International School London) and Mary Hayden: a variation

on this line-up will lead the 2003 sessions.

Overall the EdD programme continues to go from strength to strength, with more than 100 teachers and administrators around the world now participating and a range of units offered. During June/July 2003, for instance, units to be offered also include *Language & Culture*, and *Educational Research: philosophy and practice*.
