MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING 6905

The Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board held on 21 November 2019 (Paper 117).

MATTERS ARISING 6906

M6881 MEMBERSHIP OF BOARDS OF EXAMINERS FOR UNITS (BEU) AND PROGRAMMES (BEP) FOR 2019/20

Department of Pharmacy and Pharmacology

The Board noted that the AP3T DoS had reported the following plan, supported by the

HoD, to ensure that QA35 requirements continued to be met while one of the AP3T External Examiners was on maternity leave: The External Examiner on maternity leave would consider work prior to boards, and review examination materials, as well as attend boards, remotely, supported by the other External Examiner. BoS Chair's action was taken to approve the Department's proposed alternative arrangements for this External Examiner's involvement in BEU/Ps, subject to the Department ensuring:

- a. Full provision of documentation to the External Examiner in a timely manner.
- b. Contemporaneous remote involvement of the External Examiner in awarding BEPs (e.g. through the use of a video or audio link), or where this is not possible, provision of their written comments on the programme.
- c. The formal involvement of the External Examiner in the decision making of BEU/Ps and in the record of its decisions.

Department of Physics

The Board noted that in response to the Board's request that the Department review, and report back on, its current practice of involving three (sometimes more / less) members of staff (two lecturers and internal moderator) for each unit at BEUs and to nominate one member of staff to represent each unit instead, in line with other Departments, the HoD had confirmed that current practice worked well.

6907 CHAIR'S BUSINESS

The Chair reported the following matters:

- Overall UG applications are up 5.6% compared to this time last year, which is
 positive, although trends are mixed across Departments. PGT applications are up
 144% (have more than doubled), which is promising but brings with it challenges
 which will need to be monitored carefully.
- Professor Stephen Ward has been appointed as new Associate Dean: International, with effect from 6 January.
- Plans are underway to launch Research Prizes across the Faculty, to be available to all involved in research from PhD students to postdocs, technical and academic staff
- Dr Ruth Webster, Department of Chemistry, has agreed to Chair the Faculty WP
 Coordination Group (comprising 4 x WP funded positions) responsible for
 coordinating WP activity across the Faculty and to provide greater focus on meeting
 OfS metric targets. Dr Shardlow flagged that the Maths Dept. outreach officer would
 benefit from the Group's membership also including an academic member of staff.
 The Chair agreed to liaise with the HoD regarding this matter.

6913 UNIVERSITY RESEARCH CENTRES

The Board approved, following review by the Faculty Research Committee (FRC) on 9 December 2019:

- The <u>continuation</u> of the Research Centre for Networks and Collective Behaviour, from 1 November 2019 until 31 October 2022 (Paper 119). Professor Wilson commented that while the Centre was relatively small, it delivers on its ambitions, the review report was sound, the staff involved continue to evolve and the Centre provides a great forum for PhD students to coalesce. The Board noted that the FRC would follow up on the points it raised during its meeting to discuss the Centre.
- A <u>change to the directorship</u> of the **Research Centre for Probability** (Paper 120). The Board agreed that a sound rationale had been provided to support the change in directorship.
