6956 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board held on 26 February 2020 (Paper 186).

6957 MATTERS ARISING

M6934 ESTABLISMENT OF PRIZES

The Board noted that the Director of Policy, Planning and Compliance and the Climate Action Framework Group had no objection to establishment of the Infineum Prizes, given the Prizes were compliant with the University's Code of Ethics. Therefore, establishment of the Infineum Prizes was approved under Chair's action.

6958 CHAIR'S BUSINESS

The Chair reported the following matters:

- The Chair thanked members for their quick response to the rapidly changing situation over the last few weeks.
- Departments are finalising online assessments, to be completed by the end of the
 week. Most Departments are changing closed book exams into 24 hour open book
 exams, with a few Departments changing these to other forms of assessment.
 Communications with fuller details will be sent to students shortly. The Board noted
 that that the Faculty chose this approach from a range of options agreed by UEB.
 Not all faculties are following this approach; H&SS and E&D are changing exams
 into a coursework format, available to students to complete throughout the whole
 examination period.
- The University has developed a 'no detriment' policy in which Departments will be given authority to account for the Coronavirus disruption when considering students' results. Exam Boards will be asked to check academic decisions using individual, unit and cohort profiles, to compare students' results against previous years and ensure they are not disadvantaged, adjusting marks or scaling if necessary. The S2 exam period will be extended, and Boards delayed, by two weeks. Central communication on this and an FAQ page for students will follow shortly. (Postmeeting: following advice issued by OfS on Friday 3rd April Senate have been asked to approve an update to this).
- The REF submission has been delayed, but the census date remains as 31st July.
 No new date has been set for submission, but the University will be given 8 months' notice once the date has been confirmed. Given the uncertainty about when the new submission date will be, the University's internal schedule will go ahead as planned.
- Research facilities are being maintained across the Faculty. MC² have a team
 coming on to campus to look after NMR and other equipment that cannot be shut
 down over this period. Staff are coming in to maintain natural environments in
 Chemistry, P&P and Physics. There is a rota to maintain the organisms (nonmammalian animals and plants) in the South of the Faculty, and animals in the
 BSU.
- There is still some low level research ongoing mainly related to animal care and maintaining animal / plant lines. There is also some Covid 19 explicit research being undertaken for production of instrumentation that is of a critical nature. The PVC Research has sent an email containing a weblink to research advice over this period covering grants, etc.
- Some Faculty staff have been involved in supplying equipment to the RUH. There
 may be opportunities for the Faculty to join the effort led by E&D regarding the
 manufacture of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE); the Faculty has donated PPE
 from our stores and another batch (gloves, protection suits and facemasks) is due to
 be sent shortly.

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6961 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board held on 26 February 2020 (Paper 186), and there were no matters arising.

6962 REPORT ON RESEARCH GRANTS

The Board received details of awards accepted by Research and Innovation Services from 19 February until 26 March 2020 (Paper 187).

The Chair congratulated in particular:

· Professor James Davenport, Department of Computer Science, for his award of

£505,756 from the EPSRC for research into Pushing Back the Doubly-Exponential Wall of Cylindrical Algebraic Decomposition. The Board noted that Dr Bradford was Co-Investigator.

SEMESTER 1 SCALING REPORT AND ERRORS IN EXAMINATION PAPERS 6963

The Board considered scaling of unit marks (Paper 188A) and errors in examination papers (Paper 188B) in Semester 1 2019/20.

The Board noted that there were 9 instances of scaling (same as Semester 1 last year); 6 in Computer Science (compared to 4 last year), 2 in Maths (compared to 5 last year) and 1 in Physics (compared to none last year), including 2 units where the mean marks were not atypical (CM30174 and CM50206), and 32 instances of means that were atypical but not scaled (compared to 34 last year).

The Chair requested that Computer Science and Maths DLTQCs review units which had Comp Sci & been scaled or had mean marks in the atypical range for a number of years, and report back to the Board.

Maths DoTs

The Chair highlighted in particular:

- CM20217 which had mean marks in the atypical range, but not scaled, in 2016/17 and 2017/18. Dr Wright explained that the unit tends to be an outlier due to the nature of the topic and because a large number of Maths students take the unit which skews the results. Dr Wright provided assurance that the BEU had reviewed the results rigorously.
- MA30234 which had been scaled in 2016/17 and 2018/19 and had mean marks in the atypical range, but not scaled, in 2017/18. Dr Shardlow explained that this unit is offered to non-Maths students.

The Chair acknowledged that units that are coursework, lab or project-based may tend to have mean marks in the atypical range because students generally perform better, disproportionately, in these types of assessment than they do in more traditional exam based units.

The Board agreed that the errors in examination papers report (Paper 188B) was suitable and relevant.
