Background and context

The Department of Education is a thriving and expanding department with an international reputation for teaching and for research that develops theory, policy and practice (www.bath.ac.uk/education). Research is organised into four research clusters: Internationalisation and Globalisation of Education; Language and Educational Practices; Educational Leadership, Management and Governance; Learning, Pedagogy and Diversity. The focus of the research within those groups is quite diverse but the principles of fairness and justice through education are a key focus for many researchers within the department. Our research informs all our teaching, and the department offers one undergraduate programme (Education with Psychology) as well as a range of postgraduate taught programmes (the full-time MA TESOL, full-time MA International Education and Globalisation, full-time Master of Research and part-time MA Education), and postgraduate research programmes (the MPhil, PhD and Doctor of Education (EdD)).

This post is intended to make a significant contribution to research and teaching around International Development and Education which sits within the Learning Pedagogy and Diversity Cluster (http://www.bath.ac.uk/education/research/learning-pedagogy-diversity/). However, there are colleagues with related research across the all clusters. The post holder will be expected to teach on the BA Education with Psychology and postgraduate programmes including the MA International Education and Globalization, MA Education and to teach and supervise research on the EdD and PhD programmes. If he/she has a relevant specialism they may also be expected to contribute to the new MA in English Medium Instruction which is currently under development.

Job purpose

To conduct research with a high potential for national/international impact and profile; undertake teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate level; supervise postgraduate research students, and undertake management and administrative duties commensurate with the role.

Main duties and responsibilities
