

Job Purpose

The Project Manager - Campus Infrastructure will manage major projects up to £100 million each, relating to new builds, alterations, and refurbishments on the University's residential estate at Claverton Down and off-campus locations, including Bristol & Bath Science Park (BBSP). The role involves overseeing teams of consultants and contractors and taking overall responsibility for managing construction/project costs and delivering to programme.

- Enhancing Project Delivery Efficiency: By managing major projects up to £100 million each, the Project Manager will ensure that construction projects are delivered on time, within budget, and to the highest quality standards. This includes new builds, alterations, and refurbishments on the University's residential estate and off-campus locations.
- Reducing Reliance on External Project Managers: The role will help the
 University save costs by decreasing the need for external consultants. In-house
 project managers possess a comprehensive understanding of the University's
 strategic objectives, enabling more effective budget management and resource
 distribution.
- Supporting Strategic Objectives: The Project Manager will contribute to the University's £1.2 billion capital programme over the next 15 years, ensuring that projects align with institutional goals and enhance the campus infrastructure. This includes projects such as the new School of Management Building, the Institute for Advanced Automotive Propulsion Systems (IAAPS), and various refurbishments and new builds.
- Improving Operational Efficiency: The role involves overseeing teams of consultants and contractors, managing construction/project costs, and delivering projects to programme. This will improve communication among stakeholders, reduce misunderstandings, and ensure seamless project performance.
- **Providing Career Advancement Opportunities:** Establishing Grade 8 Project Manager roles will offer current Grade 7 PMs a clear pathway to progress, fostering professional growth and job satisfaction. Investing in internal staff development ensures that valuable project management expertise remains within the University.
- Ensuring Health and Safety Compliance: The Project Manager will develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure safe and successful project management practices, maintaining the health and safety of themselves and others by following all University policies and procedures.

Key Responsibilities

Project Management: Lead the successful initiation, planning, design, execution, monitoring, controlling, and closure of projects. Ensure compliance with cost, time, and quality benchmarks established at feasibility sign-off.

Resource Management: Agree, manage, and monitor project resources against the project plan. Forecast resources, timescales, and milestones to ensure efficient project delivery.

Risk Management: Identify and manage risks, resolve complex issues, and maintain risk registers. Use your knowledge, experience, and initiative to mitigate potential project risks.

Financial Oversight: Take overall financial authority and responsibility for projects, including instructing changes and ensuring efficient resource allocation.

Stakeholder Engagement: Work closely with stakeholders and the University's senior management team to develop project briefs and maintain communication throughout the project lifecycle. Ensure that all advice and developments align with University strategy and policies.

Construction Phase Leadership: Lead and manage the construction phase of projects through the contractor and consultant team. Ensure that projects are completed efficiently and effectively, meeting all necessary requirements, budgets, and client expectations.

Policy and Procedure Development: Develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure safe and successful project management practices. Ensure compliance with legal and regulatory requirements.

Scope and Specification Management: Plan and define project scope, prepare specifications, scoping documents, tender, and contract documents. Obtain prices for consultant retainers and general building contracts.

Project Programming: Establish realistic project programs from the outset with sensible contingency plans. Monitor project progress throughout its lifecycle.

Progress Monitoring and Reporting: Monitor and report on project progress, including providing reports to Project Control Groups, University Council, and Finance Committee.

Conflict Resolution: Manage difficult situations on-site and deal with potential claims. Engage in and sometimes chair meetings with diverse audiences, including stakeholders, residents, students, consultants, contractors, University Committees, and the senior management team.

Team Leadership: Develop cohesive project teams, ensuring that all team members are aligned and working towards common goals. Manage in-house resources and oversee consultants and contractors for projects both on and off-campus.

Health and Safety Compliance: Maintain the health and safety of yourself and others by following all University policies and procedures at all times. Ensure that all project activities comply with health and safety regulations.


