Department of Economics

The Department is a vibrant and diverse community of research active members. What began as a four-member Political Economy Group (PEG) of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) when the university was founded in 1966, is now a team of fifty-eight academics.

You will meet and work with colleagues from different parts of the world, representing different nationalities and ethnicities.

Research has been a key factor in the development of the Department, where staff undertake research in a wide range of areas across the subject. Broadly, they are organised in five research groups, reflecting the traditional sub-fields and methodological approaches in Economics.

They facilitate discussion and acollaboration with external stakeholders on economic issues of interest to wider audiences.

The Department runs two regular weekly seminar programmes, in addition to internal brown bags run by research groups. It runs several specialised workshops and conferences, most of them with international participation.

The Department is currently hosting Prof. Kaushik Basu (Cornell, former Chief Economist, World Bank) as a University Global Chair 2025-27. Other honorary members include Daron Acemoglu (MIT, Nobel Laureate 2025), Scott Barrett (Columbia) and Anil Markandya (Basque Centre for Climate Change).

The Department is led by Prof. Ajit Mishra, Dr. Lucy O'Shea and Dr. Andreas Schaefer and Ms Niamh Rutterford (Department Manager).

- Sustainable Development


Across these groups, there are smaller clusters also on Banking and Finance, Economics of Digitisation and Innovation, and Experimental Economics.

Staff are engaged in research with impacts on policy making and practice in the wider economy. Several members act in advisor capacities (either as consultant or panel member and knowledge exchange partner) in several organisations, including Central Bank of Iceland, DEFRA, Medical Research Council, World Bank, UNDP, UNEP, Local Councils, Committee on Minimum Wages (India) and Institute of Economic Growth.

Staff regularly contribute to popular digital and print media, on important social issues. A collection of recent writings and interviews include the effect of political posts on academics' credibility, the issue of low attendance in schools on Fridays, the impact of shared parental leave, the need for stricter drink driving limits, the health impact of urban developments, cost of car emissions and impact of Al.









Education

In addition to offering research degree programmes (PhD, MPhil), the Department has successful taught postgraduate programmes in Economics, Economics & Finance, and Applied Economics. It also runs an online postgraduate programme in Applied Economics. The Department has a very successful undergraduate degree programme in Economics and two bespoke joint honours degrees in Economics with Politics and Economics & Mathematics

The department currently boasts nearly 1400 students across all years and courses, including a large body (about 200) of international students.

The department has maintained its reputation as an excellent centre of learning, counted in the top ten of most UK based overall rankings, with outstanding employability scores (Second rank in the country, according to the Complete University Guide 2025, https://www.thecompleteuniversityguide.co.uk/league-tables/rankings/economics).




Our Commitment

Academic rigour

Our education provision is characterised by high quality and research informed teaching, and regular monitoring of our curriculum.

Our curriculum puts emphasis on skills and analytical tools rather than information gathering, and facilitated by a dedicated placement team and Employer and Alumni Advisory Board. Around 200 students are on year-long placement with various organisations.

You will be providing leadership to one of the research groups. Each group has its own regular brown bags and organises one or two workshops annually. Some colleagues contribute to multiple research groups and various Centres and Institutes at the University (i.e. Centre for Development Studies, Centre for 21st Century Public Health, Institute of Sustainability and Climate Change, Centre for Climate Adaptation and Environment Research, Institute for Policy Research).

The Department hosts several visitors, in addition to seminar and conference speakers, for longer durations. You will be able to interact and collaborate with a wide pool of researchers. We have partnerships, organisations and active association with other research organisation and policy bodies- which you can work with.
