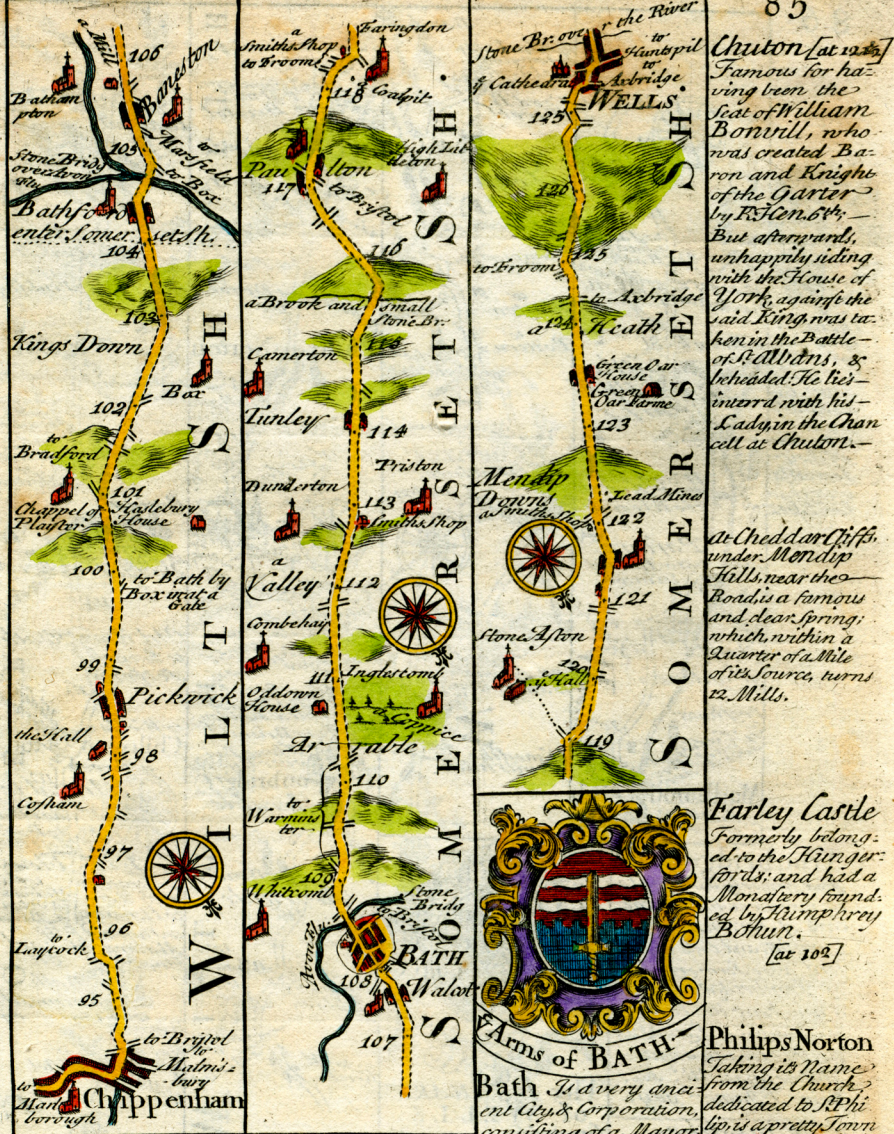


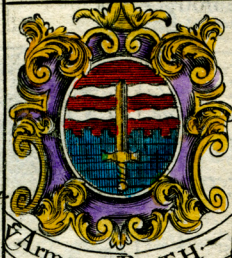


Chilton [at 125]
Famous for having been the seat of **William Bonville**, who was created Baron and Knight of the Garter by R. Hen. 6th. But afterwards, unhappily siding with the House of York, against the said King, was taken in the Battle of **Bellbush**, & beheaded. He lies interred with his Lady in the Chancel at Chilton.

Cheddar Giffs under **Mendip Hills**, near the Road, is a famous and clear spring, which, within a Quarter of a Mile of its source, turns 12 Mills.

Earley Castle
Formerly belonged to the **Hungerford**s; and had a Monastery founded by **Humphrey Bohun**.

Arms of BATH

(annually chosen out of) 10 Aldermen, a Recorder, 2 Bayliffs or Sheriffs, a Town-Clerk, 90 Common Council-men, & (out of them chosen yearly) a Chamberlain, Constables, Sergeants at Law, &c. Here are three famous hot Springs, vizt The Cross Bath, the Hot Bath, and the King's or Royal Bath, whose heat is by some Persons attributed to their passing through certain Sulphureous Veins of the Earth, and by others to a real Subterraneous Fire. They are found by experience to be so beneficial in many cases especially Impotency, Sterility &c. That great numbers of the best Quality & distinction resort hither for their use, to the great advantage of the City, which is in a very flourishing Condition, well built & inhabited, having 3 Par.
