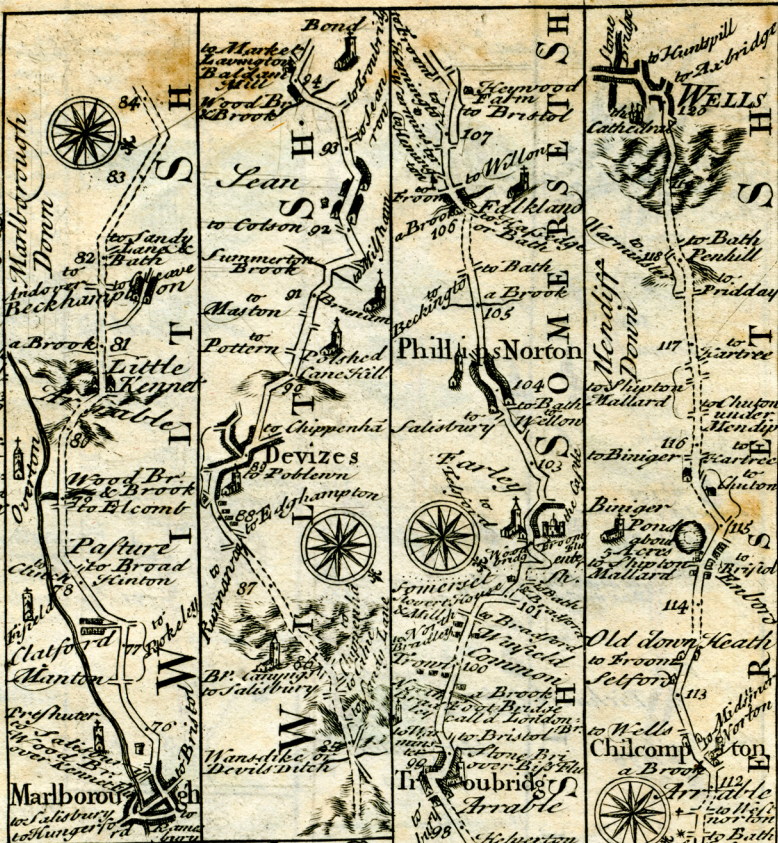




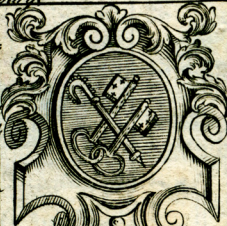

supposed to have been made by the Saxons, on the Settlement of
their Kingdom in these parts, to prevent the Incursions of the
Britons; it is like that which Offa made to defend his Mercians.
