9.	REFLECTIONS ON ACCOUNTABILITY, TRANSPARENCY AND GOVERNANCE: NORMS, INSTITUTIONS AND PRACTICES FOR A DEMOCRATIC UNIVERSITY	TP
	In addition to taking up specific points as we have been doing, we need to open a broader conversation about different models of structure and forms of participation, transparency and accountability within them. It is helpful to distinguish formal (what is to be governed) and operational (how you go about it) aspects of governance. The practice of governance is what is done – proclamations are not so important. The CESG grid doesn't clearly differentiate between these which makes it difficult to understand.	
	 Initial ideas to take this forward: In focus groups for Halpin Review it was suggested that simple representation of governance structures should be drawn up so people can understand easily. This would help to generate alternatives. Suggest to Chair of AA that a talk on governance should be part of induction for new staff.
