
An increasingly strong international reputation



Recruitment and Admissions

- 16,431 applications for FT PGT courses and 32,825 UG applications for 2022 entry
- UG applications for 2023 are up by 5.3% and PGT applications are up by 33.2%

- · Last year, we returned to a campus-based education whilst retaining the successes of the 'Bath Blend'
- This year, circa 96% of all pre-Covid in-person delivery has been face-to-face, with around 4% online interactive learning

- New Education Data Insights Group robust data and analysis to support continual improvement of our education and student experience


