The collection was transferred to the University Archives by Dr Steve Wharton, Department of Politics,

Languages & International Studies (PoLIS), in April 2019.

BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE HISTORY OF BATH UNIVERSITY PLAYERS

Bath University Players (BUP), the University of Bath staff drama society, was formed in October 1969.

Membership was open to academic and non-academic staff and their families. BUP regularly

collaborated with Bath University Drama Society (BUDS), the student drama society which later became

Bath University Student Theatre (BUST). BUP's main activity focussed on the rehearsal and performance of dramatic productions but also included organising theatre outings and social events.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the contents list. It covers the period from 1969 to 1993

and comprises a small amount of documentation relating to the administrative management and

dramatic outputs of Bath University Players. It offers a valuable, though incomplete, record of the

theatrical and artistic pursuits of staff in the early decades of the University's development and growth.
