GENERAL INTRODUCTION

PROVENANCE

The main body of the material was received in 2005 on deposit from England Hockey, the governing body for hockey in the UK. At that time the Collection comprised material assembled over several years from various different sources. Smaller supplemental donations of publications and papers have subsequently been made by private individuals. The Collection remains in the ownership of England Hockey.

BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE HISTORY OF WOMEN'S HOCKEY IN THE UK

The earliest origins of hockey are unclear but pictorial evidence from as far back as 2000 BC is often cited to suggest that some form of the game was played by the ancient Egyptians. Whatever the details of its long and complex ancestry, the modern sport of hockey does not appear to have been played widely by women until the 1880s. The first known UK women's hockey club was established in East Molesey, Surrey, in 1887 and from this date the popularity of women's hockey, both in the UK and around the world, grew rapidly. The Ladies' Hockey Association, later the All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA), was formed in 1895 by a small group of dedicated amateur players. Over the next century the AEWHA oversaw the expansion, development and governance of hockey in the UK played by women, authorising changes to the rules, organising tournaments and international tours, selecting players for the national team and presiding over a country-wide network of affiliated clubs. The AEWHA was replaced by the English Hockey Association (EHA), established to govern men's and women's hockey jointly, in 1997.

The official records of the AEWHA that form the core of the Collection are complemented by the personal collections of pioneering players and supporters of the sport. Individuals like Gwendoline Parr (1878-1956) who led the Irish team in the early 1900s, Hilda Light (1890-1967) who in 1924 captained at county, territorial and national level before serving as AEWHA president, Marjorie Pollard (1899-1982) the legendary goal-scorer who went on to become a respected sports journalist and author, Mary Russell Vick (1922-2012) who excelled at golf, cricket and tennis as well as hockey and many others. These player collections, in combination with the AEWHA records, offer a well-rounded and unparalleled insight into the beginnings and growth of women's hockey, documenting its transformation from a pass-time for the leisured classes into a competitive, mass participation, Olympic sport.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the contents list. It covers the period from *c*1895 to 2003.

Section A, All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA), contains material relating to the organisation, activities and day to day management of the governing body for women's hockey in the UK from its formation in 1895 until it was superseded by the English Hockey Association in 1997. It includes minutes of meetings, affiliated club lists, rulebooks, newsletters and associated publicity. It also includes a small amount of material relating to territorial (West and South) women's hockey associations.

Section B, International Federation of Women's Hockey Associations (IFWHA), documents the internationalisation of women's hockey as player nations cooperated to improve and promote the game worldwide. As well as more general administrative papers relating to UK participation in the management of IFWHA, the section also contains material relating to the organisation of a series of triennial IFWHA conferences and tournaments between 1930 and 1983.

Section C, Events, is the largest section in the catalogue, comprising a chronological sequence of programmes, flyers and handbills relating to local, regional, national and international hockey events of all types between 1905 and 1998. The section also contains material relating to the Women's Hockey World Cup between 1974 and 2002.

Section D, Scrapbooks, albums, photographs & negatives, contains a range of material assembled by prominent and well-known hockey players and advocates of the sport. Over sixty scrapbooks and albums covering the period from 1898 to 1961 offer a uniquely personal perspective on the early days of women's hockey in the UK. An extensive collection of photographic prints and negatives, many donated by Pat Ward, editor of *Hockey Field*, record hockey-related events as well as the changing visual identity of the sport of hockey.

Section E, Hockey Association (HA), comprises material, including minutes of meetings, handbooks and annual reports, relating to the governing body for men's hockey in the UK. Although women's hockey, governed separately by the All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA) until 1997, is the primary focus of the Collection, the material in this section forms a useful point of comparison between the sport as played and managed by men and by women.

Section F, Press cuttings, contains several collections of press cuttings relating to both women's and

men's hockey dating from 1931 to 2001.

Section G, National Hockey Centre (Milton Keynes), comprises minutes of meetings, correspondence and architectural plans relating to the development and construction of hockey's first

national playing headquarters between 1988 and 1998.

Section H, English Hockey Association (EHA), contains correspondence and papers relating to the

formation in 1997 of a new association to jointly govern both women's and men's hockey in England.

The EHA was dissolved in 2002 and shortly afterwards England Hockey was established as the

national governing body of the sport.

SECTION A ALL ENGLAND WOMEN'S HOCKEY ASSOCIATION (AEWHA)

The Ladies' Hockey Association, the precursor of the All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA), came into being in Brighton on 10th April 1895 as a result of the efforts of a small number of enthusiastic and determined women hockey players. Shortly after its formation, the AEWHA requested affiliation with the Hockey Association. The all-male Association declined this request and the governing body of the women's game subsequently remained separate for over a century.

In late 1992 the National Councils of the Hockey Association (HA) and the AEWHA began discussions regarding the possible future formation of a new association to govern both women's and men's hockey in England. The English Hockey Association (EHA) was officially established on 1st June 1997 to unite the separate governing bodies for men's and women's hockey.

A/1 COUNCIL 1895-1932 This sub-section contains records relating to the AEWHA Council. A

preliminary meeting of the Ladies' Hockey Association took place on 10th April 1895 in Brighton, but the Association's first formal meeting took place in Westminster on 23rd November 1895. From this date on the executive body of the All England Women's Hockey Association, as it became known in 1896, met regularly in locations around the country to discuss and formulate policy for the governance and conduct of women's hockey in England.

A/5 AFFILIATED CLUBS 1896-1959

Women students at the University of Oxford were known to be playing hockey in the 1880s and by 1890 the game had spread to Newnham College, Cambridge, but the first recorded women's hockey club, established in 1887, was in East Molesey, Surrey. As more clubs were set up and the number of women hockey players grew, there was a growing need for a national organisation to oversee, co-ordinate and promote the women's game. From the time of the first formal meeting of the All England Ladies' Hockey Association in November 1895 the number of clubs applying for affiliation increased rapidly.

This sub-section contains lists of clubs affiliated to the All England Women's Hockey Association. From 1899 these lists were printed annually recording the geographical spread of women's hockey as an organised sport and the rapid rise in the number of players.

A/9 WESTERN COUNTIES WOMENS' HOCKEY ASSOCIATION 1900-1994

Formed in 1900 the Western Counties Ladies' Hockey Association was affiliated to the All England Women's Hockey Association in 1902. All clubs in the counties of Herefordshire, Gloucestershire, Somerset, Wiltshire, Devon, Dorset and Cornwall were eligible for membership on payment of an annual subscription. The Association was governed by an elected Council and only members of affiliated clubs could be selected to play in international, territorial or county matches. The Western Counties Ladies' Hockey Association became the Western Counties Women's Hockey

Association in 1923.

The scrapbooks and albums have been preserved intact because they include important evidence of hockey as it was played at all levels and because they document the lives, interests and occupations of dedicated and active contributors to the organisation, promotion and development of the game of hockey in the UK.

1898-1961

This sub-section contains scrapbooks and photo albums relating to hockey. Compiled by a wide range of mainly women players and enthusiasts, they date back almost as far as the organised game in the UK and comprise a variety of material including match and tournament programmes, team lists, photographs and newspaper cuttings. In addition, because many of the scrapbooks were assembled to commemorate an overseas tour, they often include material relating to the travel arrangements and accommodation of players abroad.

Although the primary focus of each scrapbook is hockey, the scope of some of the earlier examples in particular is broader. Coverage may include other sports, formal and informal social occasions, and foreign and sight-seeing excursions. In this way, as well as documenting the lives of hockey players at local, regional, national and international levels, the scrapbooks offer an insight into the changing social context in which the game of hockey was played.

Light played in the South Hampstead High School hockey team before being selected to play right half for Pinner and for Middlesex in 1909. In 1913 she joined Chiswick Ladies' Hockey Club. By 1914 she was playing territorial hockey for the South and, in the same year, joined the England team. In 1924 she achieved the distinction of captaining her club, county, territory and country. She retired as a player the following year.

During World War I Light worked as a nurse and was stationed in Abbeville and Wimereux, France, between 1916 and 1919.

Light served as President of the All England Women's Hockey Association from 1931 to 1947.

The albums comprise mainly photographs, including a series of Middlesex team portraits, but also contain some press cuttings. Hockey and other sports are the main topics covered by the albums, but family holidays, trips abroad, sporting events and social occasions are also represented.

SECTION E HOCKEY ASSOCIATION (HA)

1910-2003

The Hockey Association (HA), the governing body for men's hockey in the UK, was founded in 1886. The All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA), founded in 1896, remained separate from the HA for a century. Both the HA and the AEWHA were superseded in 1996 when the English Hockey Associated was formed to unite the separate governing bodies for men's and women's hockey.

The Hockey Association material presented in this section is not comprehensive. It has been preserved as part of the Hockey (AEWHA) Collection at the University of Bath for purposes of comparison.

SECTION G NATIONAL HOCKEY CENTRE (MILTON KEYNES)

1988-1998

It had long been agreed that hockey needed a national playing headquarters like football (Wembley), rugby (Twickenham) and cricket (Lords). The National Hockey Centre Development Committee, with joint Hockey Association, All England Women's Hockey Association and Sports Council membership, was set up to further this aim and in 1992 a charitable trust, the National Hockey Foundation, was established to develop and operate the national hockey stadium at Milton Keynes. (The Foundation existed completely separately from the sport's national governing bodies.)

The stadium was completed in 1995 and was the home of English hockey as well as the venue for national and international matches. Until 2009 it was also the headquarters of England Hockey, the national governing body of hockey.

Owing to pressing financial constraints the Trustees of the National Hockey Foundation took the decision to sell the lease of the stadium in 2007. After the sale, the Foundation's principle remit became the administration of the substantial funds resulting from the sale for the benefit of sport in general and hockey in particular.

Most of the material in this section was received from Robin Elliott who, as President of the Hockey Association, attended Council meetings of the National Hockey Foundation.

SECTION H ENGLISH HOCKEY ASSOCIATION (EHA)

1993-2000

In late 1992 the National Councils of the Hockey Association (HA) and the All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA) agreed that there should be talks regarding the possible future formation of a new association to govern both women's and men's hockey in England. It was further agreed that the proposed association should be a completely new body and not a merger of the two existing associations.

The English Hockey Association (EHA) was officially established in 1997 to unite the separate governing bodies for men's and women's hockey, the Hockey Association and the All England Women's Hockey Association.

The English Hockey Association suspended activities owing to financial difficulties in 2002. The following year England Hockey was established as the (new) national governing body of the sport.
