Eligibility

To be eligible for an Arts Scholarship, you must be registered on any **undergraduate or postgraduate programme** at the University of Bath in the academic year 2023-4. This can include placement (full or part-year), remote study, part time or international students.

Previous applicants/successful scholarship recipients can apply.

Funding and payment of awards

Arts Scholars will receive a £1000 grant.

The grant will be paid in two instalments: £500 by Friday 3rd November 2023 and a further payment of £500 by Friday 26th January 2024. You must have provided your bank details upon request and attended the first Arts Scholar session on Wednesday 25th October in order to receive your first payment. You must continue to engage appropriately with the Arts Scholarship Programme in order to receive your second payment. Failure to do so may result in your Scholarship being revoked.

Additional support

Arts Scholars will:

- Have the opportunity to meet and work with the SU Arts team, mentors, and professional artists
- Be involved in performance experiences and opportunities for public showcases
- Receive support in promotion of your art within the Bath community

How and when to apply

You can apply for an Arts Scholarship through the <u>online form.</u> You must have submitted your application by **23:45 (GMT) on Tuesday 3rd October 2023** to be considered.

Selection and allocation

If you are successful in being shortlisted, you will be invited to audition in the week commencing **Monday 16th October 2023**. You must ensure that you are prepared and available to audition this week.

Successful applicants will be awarded an Arts Scholarship following audition and will be invited to their **first** Arts Scholar session on Wednesday 25th October 2023.

Arts scholarships are discretionary. This means that even if you meet all of the relevant criteria, you are not guaranteed to receive an award.

Please note: Arts Scholarships and Music Tuition Awards cannot be dual awarded unless you have applied with separate artforms. If you have applied with the same artform and are successful in being awarded both, you will receive an Arts Scholarship as default.





Requirements of an Arts Scholar

- It is expected that the scholar will continue to develop a high-level of performance in their artistic progression as an Arts Scholar.
- Scholars must agree to participate in at least one element of the University Arts community, such as providing content, performing at an SU Arts event, a showcase of your work either locally or on campus, teaching others or involvement in clubs/societies.
- Scholars may be required to attend events where their benefactor (donor) or benefactor's representative may be present, including the Scholarship Reception, if it takes place in this academic year.
- Scholars will be expected to attend all Arts Scholarship meetings.
- Scholars will be required to provide information about their progress, for example by writing blogs, providing photographs, or sending project/performance information to the Arts Scholarship team on a regular basis. This information may be used to promote the Arts Scholarships by the University.
- Scholars will be required to provide information to the Department of Development & Alumni Relations (DDAR, known as The Advancement Office from August 2023) regarding this scholarship. This includes, but is not limited to, a quote for an introductory letter (within one month of receiving your award) and answering a short questionnaire at the end of the year, this is to communicate to your donor how the funds have been used for your artistic development.
- Scholars are required to fill in a feedback form at the end of the scholarship year.
- All reports and feedback requests must be completed and returned by the appropriate deadline and all correspondence responded to in a timely manner to meet with the terms of scholarship.

Suspension, withdrawal from studies or study deferral

If you suspend, defer or withdraw from your studies whilst in receipt of an Arts Scholarship, you will not be eligible to receive further payments of your award that academic year. You must notify the Arts Scholarship team on arts-scholarships@bath.ac.uk if your circumstances change.

If you defer or withdraw and restart, any award already offered will become void.

Publicity, Photography and Filming

- Your name, the name of your scholarship, and excerpts from your application, survey responses, any reports or letters you provide for your donor may be used in online and print materials to promote and publicise the impact of our philanthropic scholarships. We will contact you before we use any material that could identify you as an individual.
- We may take photographs and short films at Arts Scholarship sessions. Unless you contact us, you will be providing your consent to the University holding and processing such images.
- These photographs and films may be used for publicity and promotional purposes for the Arts Scholarship or for the University of Bath in a wide variety of formats. This may include hard copy literature (such as funding leaflets, the University Prospectus, or newsletters to donors), web pages and social media platforms.
- If you do not wish for your image to be used, please write to the Arts Scholarship Team (arts-scholarships@bath.ac.uk) to state this. If you do contact us, please be advised that whilst we will endeavour to ensure that your images will not be used going forward, we will not be able to prevent it from being used in materials that are already in circulation.





General Terms and Conditions

Scholarships are allocated for 2023/4 entry only.

By accepting a scholarship, you are agreeing to the Department of Development & Alumni Relations sharing information about you from your Arts Scholarship application form with the Donor(s) who funded your Scholarship.

Should any of these Terms and Conditions **not** be met, the University reserves the right to withdraw the Scholarship at any point within the academic year. This includes not providing your bank details upon request or attending the first Arts Scholarship session on Wednesday 25th October 2023.

These Terms and Conditions are supplementary to our general Terms and Conditions, and must be read in conjunction with these.
