

Guidance on Baby Changing and Breastfeeding on University campus

The University campus is breastfeeding friendly and there are no restrictions on bottle or breastfeeding at the University except in the laboratories.

The following have been identified to offer space for breastfeeding and expressing. These rooms are also available for taking medication and therapeutic relaxation, etc. It is however recognised due to the size of the campus that informal local arrangements may be more appropriate to meet individual needs.

- **Baby changing facilities can be found in the following locations:**

1. East Building, Room 0.4B
2. The Edge, Room 0.14
3. Norwood House (Students' Union), Room 2.8
4. 4 West, Room 1.6

All of the above rooms have baby changing tables and are on the ground floor level.

In the Edge building, three baby changing tables are provided: both ladies' and gents' toilets have a table each together with an additional table in a disabled-unisex toilet.

- **Welfare Room:**

A room dedicated for the use of expectant and nursing mothers as well as for treating any health conditions that require applying medicine/resting during the work day is available in Wessex House 3.47A. This room (with a 'rest room' sign on the door, see picture below) contains a bed to aid relaxation, a chair for milk to be expressed and a fridge for storage.
