- Be aware of your **unique skills** as a Languages graduate such as communication, adaptability and resilience.
- Follow small to medium organisations online to gain awareness and access to job opportunities.
- Tailor ALL your applications to the role. It is a very competitive field and organisations need people with skills that match their competencies.

Introduction

What jobs do Modern Languages graduates do?

Modern Languages graduates find employment in business, UK and European government, engineering, financial services, media, technology, travel and tourism, and the voluntary and charitable sector.

There are a small number of jobs where languages are the main requirement e.g. Interpreter, Translator, Teacher. There are other jobs such as working for the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO), in the UK Government in European related policy areas or

via business functions like marketing, sales, supply chain management, customer support or consulting, so languages, amongst other skills, will be valued. Roles that require strong communication skills like PR, Events

Management, Media and Lobbying might also suit the linguist especially where the business is focused outside of the UK. For a general overview read this guide.
