Top Tips

- As a Politics graduate you can work in many different roles, therefore it is vital that you research your career options and understand what you value in a job.
- There are **graduate roles** in **Civil Service**, Fast Stream is not the only way in.
- **Network**, talk to people in roles you are interested in as there are many different job roles in both private/public sector.
- Advertised jobs are sometimes hard to find so research employers and **approach them directly.**
- Follow small to medium organisations online to gain awareness and access to job opportunities.
- To get **policy and research roles in think tanks**, you generally need a Master's degree.
- **Tailor ALL your applications** to the role. It is a very competitive field and organisations need people with skills that match their competencies.
