Guidelines for abstracts and posters

The call for abstracts from is open from now until 14th of July, 2017.

The word limit for abstracts is 250 words, and each abstract will appear in the online abstract book exactly as entered in the online form.

An individual may be primary author on more than one abstract only if presenting both a talk and poster.

Presentation Formats

There are **two** types of talk presentations to choose from:



- **Oral**

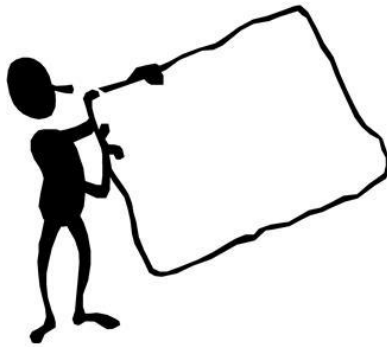
Oral presentations have a duration of **10** minutes for your presentation and **2-3** minutes for questions. There will be a brief **5** minute gap after each group of talks to allow participants to change rooms.

- **IGNITE! Talks**

These are quick rapid fire research talks. In this type of research talk, presenters get **20 slides**, which automatically advance every **15 seconds**. This style of talk is fast and fun, and only lasts **5 minutes** per presentation!

There are **two** types of poster presentations to choose from:



- **Poster - Data Collected**

This type of poster should present **completed qualitative or quantitative pieces of research**. Main points about the research should be included, all images/graphs should be clear and the font should be readable from a distance.

- **Research Proposal Poster**

This type of poster can involve **proposed study ideas** or **partially analysed/completed** work. This poster format may be especially useful for MSc, MRes and First Year PhD students who have not yet collected data, or for attendees who wish to get peer-level feedback on research study/paper ideas.

Posters can either be submitted in A1 or A0 format. Posters will be displayed throughout the duration of the conference, and there will be dedicated 1.5 hour poster session on the Friday, during which the participants are expected to stand by their poster.
