#2 Ensuring that research is conducted according to appropriate ethical, legal and professional frameworks, obligations and standards

- Have clear policies on ethical approval
- Make sure all researchers are aware of and understand policies and procedures relating to ethical approval
- Support researchers to reflect best practice in relation to ethical, legal and professional obligations and standards
- Have appropriate arrangements in place through which researchers can access advice and guidance on ethical, legal and professional obligations and standards

#3 Supporting a research environment that is underpinned by a culture of integrity and based on good governance, best practice and support for the development of researchers

The University, as a minimum should have:

- Clear policies, practices and procedures to support researchers
- Suitable learning, training and mentoring opportunities to support the development of researchers
- Robust management systems to ensure the policies relating to research, research integrity and researcher behaviour is implemented
- Awareness amongst researchers of the standards and behaviour expected of them
- Systems within the research environment that identify concerns at an early stage and mechanisms for providing support to researchers in need of assistance
