Additional Costs

You must pay a deposit of £200 per unit if studying at the University of Bath. This is non-refundable but will be deducted from the total unit cost.

There is an administration charge of £50 per unit if studying at the Summer School. You must pay the cost of attending the Summer School. This includes travel, breakfast and evening meals and accommodation.

You must cover the costs of IT equipment to enable participation on the course from a distance.

Careers and professional development

With an enhanced understanding of international education and related issues, and a specialist qualification in this field, you will be in a strong position to develop your career.

While this course does not lead to Qualified Teacher Status in the UK, a specialist postgraduate qualification in international education is regarded by many schools to be important for teaching or leading in an international context.
