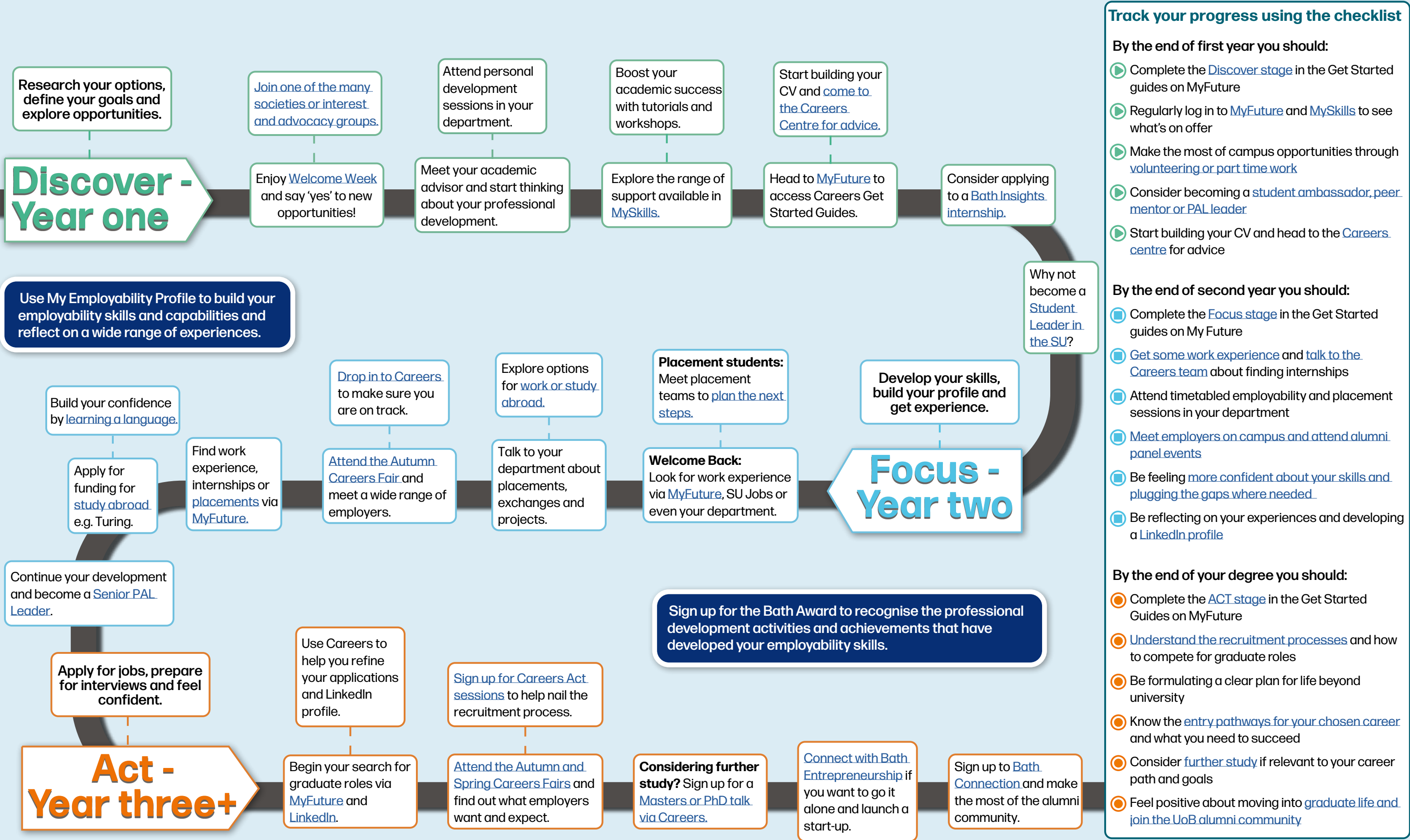


Your Undergraduate Employability Journey
