

# Graduate Outcomes 2019/20

Full-time UK domiciled first degree graduates - 15 months after Bath

The University of Bath has an excellent record of graduate employment, featuring in the top ten for graduate prospects in three major national league tables\*. Across all subjects, 93% of Bath 2019/20 graduates who are employed in the UK are in high skilled employment, compared to 73% nationally. Hundreds of employers of all sizes and from all industries each year advertise vacancies, deliver presentations or network with our students; we are in the top 20 universities targeted by employers<sup>#</sup>.

The information shown here is from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Graduate Outcomes survey for 2019/20 leavers. It is the biggest UK annual social survey and captures the perspectives and current status of recent graduates, 15 months after leaving university.

Many Architecture graduates will find employment within the architecture sector, further developing their knowledge of how to successfully control, compose and construct internal spaces and external forms. They will have excellent collaborative and communication skills as well as high levels of creativity and design skills. An awareness of how to integrate sustainable and environmental principles as well as innovative materials into compelling architecture opens routes into planning, sustainability, and consultancy as well as further development as an architect.

The majority of Architecture graduates in employment are working in architecture practices. These range from the large and prestigious to small, niche partnerships and graduates can find work in a range of types of architecture.

Some Architecture graduates find work in large consultancies who work on large design and build projects. Others may also choose to pursue a career in design-related roles such as filmmaking or museum curation, or to work in planning or conservation. The most frequent of the industry categories are:

• Professional, scientific and technical activities

The job titles Architecture graduates progress into can vary, often depending on the size of the firm they join. Some reflect the need to gain further qualifications before full accreditation, such as Architectural Assistant.

Others, particularly in larger firms, reflect the range of skills architects possess in terms of managing projects.

The vast majority of our UK employed Architecture graduates are in high skilled employment. High skilled employment includes these three categories:

- Managers, directors and senior officials
- Professional occupations
- Associate professional and technical occupations

Examples of job titles for the 2019/20 cohort:

- Architectural Assistant
- Architectural Designer
- Artist
- Assistant Landscape Architect
- Audit Associate
- Passive House Consultant

## Further study

To qualify fully as an accredited Architect, further study in the form of a MArch (RIBA Part II) and in-practice RIBA PART III are required. An appreciable proportion of Architecture graduates choose to progress straight into a MArch course following their BSc and others are completing it alongside their employment. Departmental tutors are always happy to advise on suitable choices.
