



Graduate Outcomes 2018/19 and 2019/20

Full-time UK domiciled first degree graduates - 15 months after Bath

The University of Bath has an excellent record of graduate employment, featuring in the top ten for graduate prospects in three major national league tables*. Across all subjects, 93% of Bath 2019/20 graduates who are employed in the UK are in high skilled employment, compared to 73% nationally. Hundreds of employers of all sizes and from all industries each year advertise vacancies, deliver presentations or network with our students; we are in the top 20 universities targeted by employers#.

The information shown here is from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Graduate Outcomes survey for 2018/19 and 2019/20 leavers combined. It is the biggest UK annual social survey and captures the perspectives and current status of recent graduates, 15 months after leaving university.

Studies within International Development with Economics covers a broad set of skills and an understanding of economic principles and development economics within the context of global and local challenges. Graduates from these courses develop many skills that make them attractive to prospective employers, including analytical and critical thinking, and team working skills, as well as specialist skills such as qualitative and quantitative research skills, an ability to evaluate data and develop arguments for different audiences. They often hold diverse roles in many different sectors such as local and national government, finance, technology, and in business.

Industries and employers

International Development career pathways are hugely versatile. Graduates enter a wide variety of sectors and industries such as local and national government, financial services, technology, consulting and not for profit sectors.

The skills International Development graduates develop include analytical thinking, research skills, teamwork and time management skills which can be used in both the public, private and third sectors.

The most frequent of the industry categories are:

- Financial and insurance activities
- Professional, scientific and technical activities
- Human health and social work activities
- Information and communication
- Public administration and defence
- Wholesale and retail trade

Occupations and job titles

International Development graduates progress into a variety of different jobs such as civil servants, management and business consultants, finance analysts, marketing and public relations executives, HR and recruitment officers and research roles.

International Development graduates often work in roles in both private and public sectors that uses their ability to explore and analyse the challenges we face as a society on a local, national, and international level. Strong critical thinking and communication skills allow graduates to align with roles in policy, finance, consulting, and research.

The vast majority of our UK employed International Development graduates are in high skilled employment. High skilled employment includes these three categories:

- Managers, directors and senior officials
- Professional occupations
- Associate professional and technical occupations

- Corporate Social Responsibility Executive
- Fast Stream - Policy Adviser
- Financial Analyst
- Graduate Stakeholder Engagement Officer
