Full-time UK domiciled first degree graduates - 15 months after Bath

The University of Bath has an excellent record of graduate employment, featuring in the top ten for graduate prospects in three major national league tables*. Across all subjects, 93% of Bath 2019/20 graduates who are employed in the UK are in high skilled employment, compared to 73% nationally. Hundreds of employers of all sizes and from all industries each year advertise vacancies, deliver presentations or network with our students; we are in the top 20 universities targeted by employers#.

The information shown here is from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Graduate Outcomes survey for 2019/20 leavers. It is the biggest UK annual social survey and captures the perspectives and current status of recent graduates, 15 months after leaving university.

Studies within Politics covers a broad-based training, spanning politics, economics, international relations and language. Graduates from these courses develop many skills that make them attractive to prospective employers, including teamwork, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills, as well as specialist skills such as critical analysis, research skills, verbal, written communication and language skills. They often hold diverse roles in many different sectors such as local and national government, media and communications, and in business.

Industries and employers

Politics career pathways are hugely versatile. Graduates enter a wide variety of sectors and industries such as local and national government, third sector and communications. They also go into business, especially within public affairs, sales, event management, consulting, finance and business analysis.

The skills politics graduates develop include enhanced critical analysis, teamwork and communication skills which can be used in the public, private and third sectors.

The most frequent of the industry categories are:

- Public administration and defence
- Professional, scientific and technical activities
- Financial and insurance activities
- Information and communication

Occupations and job titles

Politics graduates progress into a variety of different jobs such as policy advisers, research officers, civil servants, management and business consultants, public affairs assistants, communication assistants, and finance, investment, consulting or data analysts.

Politics graduates often work in roles in both private and public sectors that uses their strong oral and written communication skills, such as in policy, consulting, sales and public affairs.

The vast majority of our UK employed Politics graduates are in high skilled employment (85%).

High skilled employment includes these three categories:

- Managers, directors and senior officials
- Professional occupations
- Associate professional and technical occupations
