

# Guaranteed Conditional Offers for Care Leavers

## 2023 Entry Cycle Terms and Conditions



The University of Bath is committed to supporting the successful applications of those who have spent time in care. We are also focused on ensuring that all students with an offer to study at Bath are academically prepared to enjoy and succeed on their chosen degree course. As such, the criteria below are to help balance flexibility within our Admissions process with academic preparedness.

In order to be eligible for a guaranteed **conditional** offer to the University of Bath, you must meet the following criteria:

### *Personal circumstances*

1. Have lived in a Foyer or be supported by a local authority Leaving Care Service and fulfil the criteria as stated in the Children (Leaving Care) Act 2000: A young person aged 16-25 years' old who has been 'looked after' for at least 13 weeks by a local authority at some point since they were 14 years old, and were in care on or after their sixteenth birthday.
2. Declare your care leaver status via UCAS or direct e-mail to the University and provide us with evidence of the above as soon as possible after you submit your application.

### *Application criteria*

3. Submit your application by the UCAS 'on time' deadline for the 2023 entry cycle.
4. Complete all sections of the UCAS application.

### *Academic criteria*

5. Demonstrate an interest in the degree you have applied for through your personal statement.
6. Be studying towards three A levels (or equivalent) qualifications. If the qualification you are studying towards is not listed on the entry requirements section of your chosen degree's webpage, please contact us before you apply to check if it is one that we can consider.
7. Meet the 'minimum entry requirements' for the course you have applied for, as specified in tables 1 and 2 below.
8. Our Pharmacy and Social Work and Applied Social Studies degrees require completion of a successful interview by all applicants; therefore, if all other criteria are met, you will be guaranteed an interview rather than a conditional offer.

9. If you are studying an Access to HE Diploma, HNC/D, Open University Credits, or if all of your qualifications are BTECs or Cambridge Technicals, you must be studying in a relevant subject-area. In addition, for many of the courses in the Tables below there is an interview as part of the admissions process for all applicants progressing via these routes, as these qualifications can be harder for us to assess on paper. In this case, you will initially be guaranteed an interview rather than an offer. Please contact us for more information.
10. For all applicants, some courses also require other specific minimum requirements before an offer can be made (see Table 2 below).
11. If you meet the above criteria and the below minimum entry requirements (and are successful at interview where applicable), you will be given a conditional offer for the course you have applied for. You can find further information about our interview process [here](#)
