Fire Assembly Point

The fire assembly point for 10 East is in the South Carpark but you can also wait safely on the grass between 10 East and the Bus Station.

There is a fire alarm test in 10 East every Friday at approximately 7:30am.

CLOAKROOM

Located in the reception area if you required luggage to be locked away for the day.

6 DISABLED ACCESS

Disabled parking for the building is at the taxi drop off/pick up point - located in the drop off area. Drive through the Bus Only lane (ignoring the open barrier) and around to 8 West, and you will see the School of Management in front of you.

If using Just 3 Words, the location is PROOF.RESULT.AMOUNT

The barriers in the building will be open and there is a lift immediately to the right through the barriers, giving good access to the building.

TOILETS

Toilets are located on each end of the corridor on level 1, and at the bottom of the left-hand stairwell in the Pavilion.

BUS TRAVEL

The First West of England Bath Unibus service runs between Bath and the University campus. Buses leave/arrive at Arrivals Square directly in front of the School of Management. Buses leave and arrive approximately every 10 minutes during the day. The cost of a single journey is £2.00 or £3.50 for a 2-trip ticket that could be used as a return. Contactless payment is preferred. The Unibus services are:

· For city centre get off at North Parade


U2 - Which goes to Oldfield Park Service 20 - Which goes to Widcombe Hill
