Transcript for how to search for a journal article using the library catalogue

This tutorial demonstrates how to search for a journal article using the library catalogue.

On the main library home page type in or paste in the details of the article you want to find. I'm looking for this article: Student Journey Work by Weaver. I can type in a few words from the title or I can include the author's surname as well. Then click on search.

The more specific your search, the more likely your item will appear at the top of the list. In my case, the article I'm looking for has appeared in second place.

If I want to read an article online I need to see whether it says 'full text available'. This will take you either to the publisher's website or a page giving you multiple options for access.

In this case it has taken me straight to our subscription to Taylor and Francis. Our resources are provided by lots of different types of subscriptions, so the article you are looking for will probably take you to a page looking quite different from this. But just read the page thoroughly and you'll find either a pdf link, like this on here, or you'll be able to read the version in html instead.
