Aims	<p>Students on taught programmes may spend significant periods of time away from the University in a wide variety of work and study environments as part of their qualification requirements. It is necessary to take steps to ensure that they are not put at increased risk to their health or safety as a consequence. The University has put in place a procedure for ensuring that all such activities are suitably assessed for risk and that appropriate control measures are in place.</p> <p>The University's Quality Assurance Codes of Practice (QA6 and QA37) aim to assure the academic quality of placement learning and Study Abroad programmes. The QA6 statement includes health and safety elements that have been agreed with the University Health, Safety & Environment Service (UHSE).</p> <p>This standard aims to support these Codes by providing a framework for ensuring the health and safety of students undertaking such programmes.</p>				
Scope	<p>This standard applies to all work placements and Study Abroad programmes organised as part of University of Bath taught degree courses.</p> <p>Work experience undertaken at the University by non-University students is covered by the Children and Young People Standard and is therefore excluded from this standard.</p> <p>Internships or vacation work which are organised outside a programme of study are excluded from this policy. However, reference should be made to the Risk Assessment Standard if there is any input from the University to this type of activity.</p>				
Relevant Legislation	<p>The Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999</p> <p>Work or study undertaken outside the UK will be subject to the laws of that country. The way the University manages these activities will remain subject to UK legislation.</p>				
Definitions	<p>Placement: This is '... a negotiated period of learning which normally takes place outside the University either in the workplace or at another institution and where the learning outcomes are an intended part of ... the programme of study.' (University of Bath QA6)</p> <p>Study Abroad: This is '... learning achieved during an agreed period ... at a Higher Education institution in a country outside the United Kingdom, and where the learning outcomes are an integral part of and contribute to the programme of study.' (University of Bath QA37 – Student Exchange Arrangements).</p>

6	The University's guidance on "International travel for staff and students on university business" is followed. FCO travel advice is consulted when assessing a work placement outside the UK or a Study Abroad proposal. Where travel is proposed to a destination where the FCO advises against " <i>all but essential travel</i> " then this must be submitted to the Director of Policy, Planning and Compliance for approval.
