University of Bath Preparations to date

- Since, 2022 we have been undertaking some internal preparations for REF to understand our current position and build on lessons learnt from previous exercises. This has included a review of our research culture, our current research portfolio and its potential for impact. These have been taking place on an annual basis, launching in the Autumn, completing in the spring and reporting to UEB in the summer.
- These exercise (called REF audits) were to help us to have a good understanding of where we are, so that we can allocate resources and support, address any risks, issues and challenges brought in through the changes to REF 2029. More about the changes to REF 2029.
- The following sets out a high-level overview of the preparations and support going forward with key dates to be aware of in the next few slides.

2026/2027 Timetable – Preparing to submit

- **September** - Launch of REF2029 Preparations (REF Audit) exercise. This will involve:
 - Contribution to knowledge and Understanding (CKU) – Ongoing peer review of eligible research outputs and drafting of CKU statements
 - People, Culture and Environment (PCE) - Drafting of PCE statements at Unit of Assessment (UoA) and Institutional Level
 - Engagement and Impact (E&I) – Drafting of Impact Case Studies and drafting of UoA E&I evidence statements
- **December** - Establishment of internal UoA assessment panels
- **April** – Internal submission of REF Audit deliverables
- **May** - Review of REF Audit submissions by UoA panels
- **June** - Report to REF strategy Steering group and to UEB on our position and preparedness

2027/2028 Timetable – Finalising our Submission

- **September 2027** - Launch of REF2029 Final Preparations (REF Final) exercise. This will involve:
 - Contribution to knowledge and Understanding (CKU) – Ongoing peer review of eligible research outputs, selection of research outputs and finalising of UoA CKU evidence statements
 - People, Culture and Environment (PCE) – Finalising PCE Evidence statements at UoA and Institutional Level
 - Engagement and Impact (E&I) – Finalising Impact Case Studies and Finalising E&I Evidence statements
- **April 2028** – Internal submission of REF Final Institutional submission
- **May 2028** - Review of REF Final submissions by UoA panels
- **June 2028** - Report to REF strategy Steering group and recommendation made to UEB
- **September 2028** - Recommendation made to Senate
- **November 2028 (tbc)** – VC and Pro-VC (Research and Enterprise) makes Institutional submission
