We have a range of plans to resume our Bath Blend of learning and teaching and to offer a mix of extra-curricular activities from February onwards.

Of course, all our plans are subject to whatever Covid rules are in place at the time, but we will be doing everything we can to make sure you have the best possible experience, in a safe environment, as you continue your studies with us here at Bath.

Learning and teaching

Thank you for your engagement with the Bath Blend in Semester 1 and for providing invaluable feedback in the two student surveys we have run over the past few weeks.

In Architecture and Civil Engineering, we have used your feedback to enhance the way we deliver the Bath Blend. We have addressed comments associated with workload and IPT delivery, while retaining flexibility in when you study. We continue to ensure that all learning outcomes can be achieved regardless of study mode.

Your timetable will be available to you from mid-January, when you'll be able to see what you can expect from the start of Semester 2 in IPT and LOIL sessions. Key highlights we would draw to your attention, however, are:

- Increasing the Wednesday IPT sessions and opportunities for peer to peer learning in the shared Multidisciplinary Project Unit (AR50475). This will include a significant amount of on campus Studio time with four-hour blocks for tutoring and a further four hours for independent working.
- There will also be additional IPT sessions timetabled for the Professional and research skills for the construction industry unit (AR50472).
- Greater coordination and consistency across units including organisation of Moodle pages and managing the overall workload;
- Greater flexibility and engagement opportunities in LOIL sessions.

Arrangements for LOIL are course specific and your course leaders will have contacted or have been in contact with you regarding how this will affect you.
