**ACTION**

#### 14582 <u>DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST</u>

The Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor declared that they knew some of the candidates for honorary degrees.

#### 14583 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Senate considered and agreed an addition to the draft minutes of the meeting held on 6 February 2019 (paper S18/19-112), namely a final bullet point in minute 14557:

 'Senate noted that exemptions to the framework may be needed as curriculum transformation rolls in over the next five years. It was agreed that these could be granted on an exceptional basis provided the request is clearly aligned with the principles of curriculum transformation.'

Senate then APPROVED the amended minutes of the meeting on 6 February 2019 as a correct record of the proceedings and they were signed by the Chair.

#### 14584 MATTERS ARISING

Minute 14540 – Effectiveness Review of Senate:
 The Vice-Chancellor explained that an invitation for expressions of interest in membership of the review group, and suggestions for the external chair, would be

2) Minute 14557 – Curriculum Transformation:
Following a series of meetings with members of Senate, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Learning & Teaching) (PVC) gave an assurance that course design would ensure

(Learning & Teaching) (PVC) gave an assurance that course design would ensure that no students would be disadvantaged by the new requirement in the Academic Framework that students pass all units. Specifically, course design would allow for options to be considered as components of larger units, with assessment either corresponding to the various components or as synoptic in design. The PVC thanked the members of Senate, and especially Professor Bird, who had contributed to this outcome.

# 14586 EDUCATION STRATEGY 2016-21

 The Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Learning & Teaching) gave an update on progress on the Education Strategy (paper S18/19–114A) and thanked everyone who had contributed to progress so far. There was a discussion of apprenticeships and the importance of monitoring recruitment.

- a) The Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Learning & Teaching) gave an update on curriculum transformation and the progress with vanguard courses (paper S18/19–114B).
   b) Senate APPROVED the success criteria for Phases 2 & 3 of Curriculum Transformation.
- 3) Senate APPROVED additions to the membership of the Curriculum Transformation Committee: Associate Dean (Learning & Teaching) School of Management, the SU Education Officer and the SU Postgraduate Officer, all as ex-officio members. Further Senate members may be needed to cope with the workload over the summer.

#### 14587 NEW COURSES AND PARTNERSHIPS

Senate CONSIDERED paper S18/19–115 presented by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Learning & Teaching). Senate granted full and final APPROVAL to the new programmes, on the recommendation of CPAC, to be delivered from 2019/20, subject to some minor clarifications as set out in the paper:

- 1) Integrated PhD in Accountable, Responsible and Transparent Artificial Intelligence;
- 2) Integrated PhD in Advanced Automotive Propulsion Systems.

In Appendix 1, p7, in the section on Structure and Content of Programme, 'Stopping Points', it was AGREED that the word 'and' would be inserted between 'Students with a Taught Stage Average less than 50%' **and** 'above the unit pass mark of 40%...'

# 14588 REF – DRAFT CODE OF PRACTICE

Mrs K McKen attended for this item. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Research) introduced the draft REF 2021 Code of Practice (paper S18/19–116) and invited comments. He explained it was an initial draft and a refined version would be brought back to the June meeting. The discussion included the following points:

PVC (R)

- What a 'REF decision' was should be better defined:
- The name and purpose of the 'Research Independence and Staff Circumstances Panel' was not clear;
- That there would be an additional review panel for oversight;
- That there was no appeal against academic judgement;
- The need for more information on the process for selection of outputs;
- That optimising the quality of the University's submission would require processes to avoid bias;
- That an Equality Impact Assessment would be carried out;
- That staff would have the right to see records of their own information;
- The existence of teaching-only lecturer contracts, and that some staff may wish to change to the new contract, but that the REF would not be used as a reason to change staff contracts;
- The need to update citation data before decisions were made, where relevant for the REF:
- In response to a question, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Research) stated that he

would consider any allegations of behaviour not consistent with the University's "Principles of research assessment and management" that were brought to his attention.

The Chair thanked all those involved in the REF preparation work.

#### 14589 **GOVERNANCE – STATUTE CHANGES AND ORDINANCE 14**

#### 1) Statutes:

The Head of Secretariat introduced paper S18/19-117A containing proposed amendments to the Statutes following decisions made by Council as a result of the recommendations of Halpin Partnership's Effectiveness Review of Council. Senate CONSIDERED the changes, which mainly related to a reduction of members from 26 to 21; amending the maximum terms of office for Council members from six to nine years (with no provision for future reappointment after the maximum term); and to permit student member attendance at Council and its Committees for reserved area business to reflect current practice since the Halpin Review. It was proposed and AGREED that 16(b)(ii) should read '...not exceeding ten in number, at least one of whom should be an alumna/us of the university, ...'

One member considered that Council should be larger than 21, to include a nominated member from the local authority and one more academic member than proposed; and that a maximum term of six years should be retained. They also recommended a specific reference to equality, diversity and inclusion. These points were noted and would be communicated to the Council HoS Effectiveness Steering Group.

It was AGREED the changes proposed in the paper would be submitted to Council, with the addition of 'at least' in 16(b)(ii).

[Secretary's note: Subsequent to the meeting, the Senate member who had suggested that Council should be larger than 21 contacted the Secretary as they believed the composition of Council would be brought back to Senate for further discussion. Neither the Chair nor Secretary had said this, but the Secretary then emailed Senate members to confirm that they had supported the changes at the meeting and a majority confirmed they had done so.]

#### 2) Ordinances:

Senate CONSIDERED paper S18/19-117B proposing an addition of a new degree, 'Master of Biomedical Sciences: MBiomed', to Ordinance 14.15 following the approval by Academic Programmes Committee. Senate AGREED to recommend this to Council.

#### 14590 **HONORARY DEGREES - CONFIDENTIAL ITEM**

Senate CONSIDERED the recommendations from the meeting of the Honorary Degrees Committee held on 25 March 2019 (Paper S18/19-118).

- 1) APPROVED the individuals to be awarded honorary degrees.
- 2) AGREED to recommend to Council the waiving of Ordinance 14.12 to permit the HoS appointment of two of the Orators who were not senior members of staff;

3) APPROVED the principles and procedure set out in Appendix 2 for reviewing an honorary degree where it may lead to rescission under Statute 17.9. There was an explanation of the due diligence process.
