

Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)



Indices of multiple deprivation (IMD) is a measure of relative deprivation for small, fixed geographic areas of the UK. IMD classifies these areas into five quintiles based on relative disadvantage, with quintile 1 being the most deprived and quintile 5 being the least deprived.

To find out your IMD quintile:

1. Enter your postcode into the box on and click 'Get Deprivation Data'



- Using the column F number, use the table below to determine your IMD quintile (the yellow column).

Index of Multiple Deprivation Decile	Index of Multiple Deprivation Quintile
1 & 2	1
3 & 4	2
5 & 6	3
7 & 8	4
9 & 10	5

- For funding purposes, you will be flagged as a widening participation priority if the home postcode listed on your UCAS application when you apply is IMD **quintile 1 or 2** (highlighted on the table above).
