Information about our awards

These Terms and Conditions refer to the University of Bath's undergraduate financial support for new students starting study in the 2026-27 academic year. Many of our awards are made under the terms of the University's 2024-2028 [Access and Participation Plan](#) and also include scholarships supported by the University and donors. All our awards have eligibility criteria that must be met and may take into account one or more of the following:

- Your family household income as defined by your student loans provider (UK 'Home' students)
- Supporting students from specific backgrounds (using [contextual data](#))
- Defined course, academic department or faculty requirements
- Your achieved Level 3 qualifications

Awards are allocated for 2026 entry only. If you defer or withdraw and restart, any award already offered or applied for will become void. If eligible, you will have to re-apply to be considered for support the following year, but this will be subject to the terms of the Access and Participation Plan, and any funding provision then in place. All of our funding information is published on our [undergraduate funding](#) web pages.

Application & General Guidance

General application information

The Gold Scholarship Programme (GSP) and Claverton Scholarship Programme (CSP) require an application to be written alongside meeting the eligibility criteria.

Provided you meet a [contextual criterion](#), you will have the opportunity to apply for the GSP from **mid-May** via your Bath Application Tracker. You will also have the opportunity to declare and upload evidence for meeting a contextual criterion if appropriate.

Eligible students will be invited to apply for the Claverton Scholarship Programme at the end of the autumn term.

Household income

In order to ensure that the University provides you with the financial support that you are entitled to, our Student Finance team will proactively import household income assessments from the Student Loans Company (SLC) on a weekly basis (with the exception of two weeks prior to payments).

We can only accept household income data that is shared with us directly from the SLC. You can still [obtain a household income assessment](#) if you do not wish to take out a student loan.

It can take 6-8 weeks for the SLC to conduct and process a household income assessment; so, we strongly recommend that you start this process as soon as possible.

The consent option to share your household income with the University will be automatically ticked within your SLC application. Please ensure that neither you nor your parent/guardian unticks this, otherwise the University will be unable to assess your funding eligibility.

The University relies on the accuracy of information received from the Student Loans Company, and occasionally the information we receive is incorrect. We reserve the right to withdraw any

award that has been based on an incorrect household income assessment, and you would not be expected to repay any monies paid.

Household income reassessments

We will always use the most up to date income assessment that we have for you, allowing us to support you if you have a drop in household income during your time at Bath.

We cannot consider any household income reassessments that are received after the closing date for specific awards e.g., the Gold Scholarship Programme, the Claverton Scholarship Programme or any relevant donor funded awards. We will use the household income assessment we have for you at the time.

Any reassessments received after Friday 12th March 2027 will be considered for the 2027/8 academic year onwards. Please contact the [Student Money Advice Team](#) for financial support and advice between this date and the beginning of the 2027/8 academic year.

We cannot retrospectively award funding that is applicable to a particular year of study e.g., if you become eligible within your second year, you will not be awarded an Accommodation Bursary or the accommodation element of the Bath Bursary, as these are only offered to first year students.

An award will not be taken away if your household income increases in any subsequent year.

Fee reassessments

Please get in contact with the [Scholarship and Bursaries Team](#) if your fee status changes from “Overseas” to “Home UK” whilst you are a student at Bath, and you consequently believe that you meet the eligibility criteria for financial support.

Students transferring to Bath

If you join the University in 2026 and transfer directly into Year 2, then you will not be eligible to apply for the Gold Scholarship Programme or Claverton Scholarship Programme.

However, you can be awarded a Bath Bursary if eligible. You may also have the opportunity to apply for a Corporate Scholarship, an Arts Scholarship and/or some of our sporting awards, managed by Team Bath.

Tasks required by the Undergraduate Admissions Team for your study application

It is your responsibility to ensure that you respond to any requests for information from the Undergraduate Admissions Team which may be required as part of your application to study, including any confirmation of offer after exam results and completing the University’s criminal convictions declaration in your [Bath Application Tracker](#).

Email communication about funding at Bath

We will email you with information about our funding awards (excluding sports awards which are managed by Team Bath) using the address provided in your UCAS application. If any of your contact details change you can update this via your [Bath Application Tracker](#). It is important that you keep this up to date, so we have the correct contact information for you.

If you have used a school email address in your UCAS application, we suggest you update this to a personal one, especially as you may no longer have access to this once you leave school/college after your exams.

Don't forget to check your junk/spam email folder in case any emails from Bath accidentally end up there.

Our Bursary and Scholarship offering

University of Bath Bursary

The Bath Bursary is worth up to £2,750 in Year 1 and up to £2,000 from Year 2 onwards, including during **unpaid** placement and study abroad periods.

Eligibility criteria for the University of Bath Bursary

To be considered you need to meet all the following:

- you commence your studies from September 2026 onwards
- you are an eligible Home UK undergraduate student
- you are registered on a full-time undergraduate degree course
- you are eligible for a student loan and have a UK student loans household income assessment of £30,000 or below

The Bath Bursary is automatically awarded to those who meet the eligibility criteria. It cannot be dual awarded with a GSP award.

The finer details

The Bath Bursary will consist of:

- **Year 1:** £1000 cash, £1000 campus credit and £750 accommodation credit
- **Year 2 onwards:** £1000 cash and £1000 campus credit

Students will not receive funding during a paid placement year.

Claverton Scholarship Programme

The Claverton Scholarship Programme is an exciting new initiative worth £1,500 in addition to the Bath Bursary.

As well as financial support, the Claverton Scholarship Programme aims to enhance student satisfaction and belonging and boost employability skills. The programme includes:

- A 3-day non-residential summer school in Year 1 and a 2-day non-residential summer school in Year 2
- Completion of the Claverton Employability Passport

Eligibility criteria for the Claverton Scholarship Programme (CSP)

To be considered you must be:

- a current first-year Bath Bursary recipient who joined the University in the 2026-7 academic year

The finer details

Upon successful completion of the CSP requirements, the following payments will be made:

- **December 2027:** £750
- **December 2028** (or in December of your final year of study): £750

Awards are limited and so not all applications will be successful - eligibility is no guarantee of an award being made.

Gold Scholarship Programme

The Gold Scholarship is worth up to £5,000 per year of study, including during **unpaid** placement and study abroad periods.

As well as financial support, the Gold Scholarship offers a compulsory enrichment programme to enhance personal development. This includes:

- 50 hours of volunteering or approved roles a year
- mentoring
- personal development, networking and skills training sessions
- support with placements and internships
- pastoral support networks

Eligibility criteria for the Gold Scholarship Programme (GSP)

To be considered you need to meet all the following:

- you are a new first year student commencing your studies in September 2026
- you are an eligible Home UK undergraduate student
- you are registered on a full-time undergraduate degree course
- you are eligible for a student loan and have a UK student loans household income assessment of £30,000 or below
- you meet one of our [contextual criterion](#) as defined by our Admissions Team
- you have applied for the GSP via your Bath Application Tracker and submitted your application by the closing date

Awards are limited and so not all applications will be successful - eligibility is no guarantee of an award being made.

Separate [Terms and Conditions](#) apply.

The finer details

The Gold Scholarship will consist of:

- **Year 1:** £3,250 cash, £1000 campus credit and £750 accommodation credit
- **Year 2 onwards:** £4000 cash and £1000 campus credit

Students will not receive funding during a paid placement year.

Accommodation Bursary

Depending on your eligibility, the Accommodation Bursary is worth either £620 or £1300 off your first year University-managed accommodation fees.

Eligibility criteria for the £1300 Accommodation Bursary

To be eligible for the £1300 Accommodation Bursary, you must meet all of the following:

- you are an eligible new first year Home UK undergraduate student starting studies in 2026/7
- you are registered on a full-time undergraduate degree course
- you are eligible for a student loan and have a UK student loans **household income assessment of between £30,000.01 and £42,875**
- you are a current student at the time of awarding and payment
- you either hold a University accommodation contract or have been allocated accommodation by the University in 2026/7

Eligibility criteria for the £620 Accommodation Bursary

To be eligible for the £620 Accommodation Bursary, you must meet all of the following:

- you are an eligible new first-year Home UK undergraduate student starting studies in 2026/7
- you are registered on a full-time undergraduate degree course
- you are eligible for a student loan and have a UK student loans **household income assessment of between £42,875.01 and £62,377**
- you are a current student at the time of awarding and payment
- you either hold a University accommodation contract or have been allocated accommodation by the University in 2026/7

Corporate Scholarships

We have a number of scholarships in partnership with leading global organisations, many of whom offer paid internships and work placement opportunities.

Awards are limited and so not all applications will be successful - eligibility is no guarantee of an award being made.

Placement Bursary

The Placement Bursary is worth up to £2,000 in an [unpaid placement year](#).

Eligibility criteria for the Placement Bursary

To be eligible, you need to meet all of the following:

- be in receipt of the Bath Bursary, Gold Scholarship, Cowrie Foundation Scholarship or [Discretionary Student Support Fund](#) (administered by the Student Money Advice Team)
- your course is defined as having a full-year (thick) or part-year (thin) unpaid placement period and
- you are currently undertaking an unpaid/study abroad placement period

If you are in receipt of a paid allowance or stipend for your placement period, that is not subject to income tax, then you will be treated as if you are on an unpaid placement.

Team Bath Sports Scholarships

Team Bath Sports Scholarships give talented individuals the opportunity to benefit from the University of Bath's world-leading sporting and academic environment. Each year we award several sporting scholarships to student athletes who demonstrate aspirations to compete to the highest level within their sport.

Awards are limited and so not all applications will be successful - eligibility is no guarantee of an award being made.

Arts Scholarships

Our Arts Scholarships give talented individuals the support needed to develop and showcase their artistic skills. They are available to all University of Bath students from year 2 onwards.

Each Arts Scholarship is worth £1,000 and is paid in two £500 instalments over one academic year.

As well as financial support, an Arts Scholarship comprises of a compulsory enrichment programme to enhance personal development. This includes:

- personal development and skills training sessions
- performance opportunities
- access to a suitable mentor and/or artistic community contacts where possible

Awards are limited and so not all applications will be successful - eligibility is no guarantee of an award being made. Applicants will need to complete an application form and those shortlisted will be invited to audition.

Many of our scholarships have additional Terms and Conditions that need to be taken into account alongside these general Terms and Conditions. You should read and refer to these before applying for an award. Details of any additional criteria that need to be met including academic progression will be detailed in award emails.

About our eligibility criteria

Eligibility criteria explained

Home UK fees status student	If you are a Home UK fees paying student, you must meet both of the following: 1. Your tuition fee status must be Home fees. 2. You must meet the general eligibility criteria for UK student loans and have applied for your household income to be assessed as part of your application for UK student loans (e.g., tuition fees and maintenance support). UK student loans are those available from Student Finance England or other UK student loans awarding agency which includes, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Please review their webpages for information about eligibility criteria for UK student loans. For students from the EU, if you have applied for a 'settled' or 'pre-settled' status, then we cannot be held responsible for any delays that may occur as a result of your application. This includes any subsequent impact on you being able to apply, or be considered for, any of our funding awards and/or delays to any eligibility for UK student loans.
Household Income (Home UK students eligible for student loans from the UK government.)	This refers to household income data that is shared with the University by your student loans awarding agency e.g., Student Finance England. Your student loans awarding agency will only carry out an assessment of your household income if you have requested this as part of your Maintenance and Tuition Fee Loan application. If you do not wish to take out a student loan, you can still obtain a household income assessment. If available, the University will import your household income data from the Student Loans Company (SLC) once you have made Bath your Firm or Insurance choice. This is unless you and/or the person whose household income your loans are assessed on have removed that permission. You can see if we have received your household income from the SLC by logging into your Bath Application Tracker and viewing this information in the Funding Package area of your account. You will also be able to view whether your household income is within a valid threshold for our funding awards. This information will move to 'Student Home' within your Student SAMIS account once you enrol as a student at Bath. If no income information is received, then you should check this with your student loans awarding agency.

	We are not responsible for any delays in your student loans application being processed or information not being passed onto us by the SLC. This includes if there is a delay in us receiving your household income if Bath was originally your insurance choice, or if your place is confirmed through Clearing. We cannot call the SLC to request your income information over the phone and cannot verify your income via any other source, other than the data import process between the SLC and the University.
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Contextual data explained

Using contextual data is a way for us to recognise and support those who may not have had the same start in life or opportunities to succeed educationally as others.

At Bath we aim to help raise these aspirations and offer financial support to help our students achieve the best they can in their degree studies. There are many barriers which may affect a person's life journey including finances, social situation, culture and/or geography.

Free School Meal (FSM) eligibility	We use data on your eligibility for free school meals (FSM) during your time in secondary education. The data we use is provided by UCAS, who verify your eligibility against the National Pupil Databases for England, Northern Ireland and Wales. The exact eligibility recorded in the National Pupil Databases varies depending on nation: • England – you were recorded as eligible for FSM at any point in the 6 years before the school census day in Year 11. • Northern Ireland – you were recorded as eligible for FSM at any point in the 6 years before the school census date in Year 12. • Wales – you were recorded as eligible for FSM at any point between the school census date in Year 11 and the January 5 years before. Please note that these sources do not include FSM eligibility recorded in Year 12 (excl. Northern Ireland).
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Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)	Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is a measure of relative deprivation for small, fixed geographic areas of the UK. Your home postcode and actual IMD quintile is shared with us from UCAS. Where it is not passed on or does not exist, we will not be able to use any other proxy data or alternative classification system. IMD classifies these areas into five quintiles based on relative disadvantage, with quintile 1 being the most deprived and quintile 5 being the least deprived. We will count your postcode as an area of general disadvantage if it is in quintile 1 or 2 and IF you attended an independent school, this was for no more than two academic years in your last four years of school or college.
Refugee Status	The definition of a refugee as defined on the UKCISA website is: (a) you must be ordinarily resident in England on the first day of the first academic year of your course; and (b) you must: • have been recognised as a refugee by the UK Government and have remained ordinarily resident in the UK and Islands since then; or • be the spouse / civil partner of such a refugee and have been in that relationship on the date on which he/she made his/her application for asylum; or • be the child of such a refugee, or the child of such a refugee's spouse / civil partner, and be able to show that on the date that refugee made his/her application for asylum, you were: i. under 18 years of age; and ii. the refugee was your parent, or your parent's spouse / civil partner. Your refugee status will be verified by our Undergraduate Admissions Team if you have declared this in your UCAS application. Please contact us if you have not declared this in your UCAS application and need to do this separately. The University has a Student Retention & Success Team who can also provide you with additional funding support and advice during your studies.

Care Leaver	<i>The Children (Leaving Care) Act 2000 definition states that a care leaver is someone 25 or under who has been in Local Authority Care for a period of at least 13 weeks or more spanning their 16th birthday.</i> You may have indicated that you are a Care Leaver in your UCAS application. If you wish to apply for the Gold Scholarship Programme, you will be given the opportunity to submit supporting evidence via the online application form which will be emailed to you from mid-May onwards. You will need to provide a letter from a social worker, Leaving Care Personal Adviser or other relevant professional confirming your care status. The University has a Student Retention & Success Team who can provide you with additional funding support and advice during your studies. You can also provide evidence direct to them if you wish.
Young Adult Carer	<i>You are classed as a young adult carer if you are a carer between the ages of 18 and 25 who looks after a relative or friend, of any age, due to disability, chronic/terminal illness, mental health problems or alcohol or drug addiction/dependency.</i> You may have indicated that you are a Young Adult Carer in your UCAS application. If you wish to apply for the Gold Scholarship Programme, you will be given the opportunity to submit supporting evidence via the online application form which will be emailed to you from mid-May onwards. You will need to provide a letter from a social worker, teacher or other relevant professional confirming your young carer status. The University has a Student Retention & Success Team who can provide you with additional advice and guidance during your studies. You can also provide evidence direct to them if you wish.

Irreconcilably estranged from family	An irreconcilably estranged person is someone who has not had any verbal or written contact with both of their parents for a significant period of time, on or before the first day of the academic year for which they are applying for funding, and this is unlikely to change. This can include your biological or adoptive parents, or your only living parent. A significant period of time is usually considered to be twelve months or longer, but this can also depend on your circumstances. If you wish to apply for the Gold Scholarship Programme, you will be given the opportunity to submit supporting evidence via the online application form which will be emailed to you from mid-May onwards. You will need to provide a letter from a social worker, teacher or other relevant professional confirming your estrangement status. The University has a Student Retention & Success Team who can provide you with additional funding support and advice during your studies. You can also provide evidence direct to them if you wish.
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How can I find out if I am eligible for funding?

From mid-May onwards, our Student Finance Team will import household income data for applicants who have made Bath either their Firm or Insurance choice, and who have requested for their household income to be assessed by the SLC. You will be able to view whether your income is within a valid threshold for our funding awards, and whether you meet a contextual criterion (needed for the Gold Scholarship Programme), by logging into your [Bath Application Tracker](#) and viewing this information in the Bath Financial Support Package area. This information will move from the Bath Application Tracker to 'Student Home' in your [SAMIS account](#) once you enrol as a student.

You will need to contact your student loans provider directly if we have not received your income assessment. We cannot call them to verify information on your behalf.

How and when to apply

You will be sent an email from the Scholarship, Bursaries and Enrichment Team reminding you of what funding is available once you have made Bath your Firm or Insurance choice. This is usually around mid-May onwards.

The Bath Bursary and Accommodation Bursary

There is **no application process for the Bath Bursary or Accommodation Bursary**. Both are awarded automatically provided we have received your household income assessment from the SLC, and it is within the stated income threshold.

We must have received your household income assessment by Friday 12th March 2027 in order to provide you with financial support for the 2026/7 academic year. If we receive an eligible household income assessment after this date, then you will be awarded a Bath Bursary from the 2027/8 academic year onwards.

The Claverton Scholarship Programme

All new Bath Bursary recipients will be emailed in early December 2026 inviting them to apply for the Claverton Scholarship Programme. Applications will close in February 2027.

The Gold Scholarship Programme

You can apply for the Gold Scholarship Programme via your [Bath Application Tracker](#). Applications will open in mid-May, and a link to apply will be included in the funding email sent to you by the Scholarships, Bursaries and Enrichment Team.

The final deadline to be considered for the Gold Scholarship Programme is **midday on Thursday 27th August 2026**.

Art Scholarships

To apply for an Arts Scholarship, you will be required to complete a written application in **Spring 2027**, and if shortlisted, you will be invited to audition. Find out more [here](#).

Please refer to our [website](#) for the closing dates of individual Sports or Corporate Scholarship awards. The University reserves the right to alter its allocation schedule, and students will be emailed about any changes if this occurs.

Selection and allocation

Allocation of the Bath Bursary

The Bath Bursary can be **awarded in any year of study provided you meet the eligibility criteria**. Any assessments or reassessments received after Friday 12th March 2027 will be considered for the 2027/8 academic year onwards. Please contact the [Student Money Advice Team](#) for financial support and advice between this date and the beginning of the 2027/8 academic year.

Allocation of the Accommodation Bursary

The Accommodation Bursary will be credited directly to your accommodation account, to coincide with the second or third accommodation payment.

Allocation cut-off date	Credited to
Friday 27th November 2026	January 2027 accommodation payment
Friday 12th March 2027	April 2027 accommodation payment

The Accommodation Bursary will only be awarded once, with the exception of students who have had a drop in household income between payments, making them eligible for a further discount. If you miss the allocation cut-off date for the January reduction, then your accommodation bursary will be allocated to coincide with the April accommodation payment. We cannot advance any accommodation payments.

Selective scholarships

All scholarships that we offer are discretionary. This means that even if you meet all of the relevant criteria you are not guaranteed to receive an award. The University and/or corporate partners will select the scholars it deems to be the most deserving in its sole discretion. Our/their decision in this respect is final and there is no right of appeal. Candidates will be selected for an award based on the eligibility criteria, any supporting statement as part of an application and any other selection methods that may be used e.g., interviews, auditions, or assessment centres.

It is the University's responsibility to identify potential award recipients on the basis of the criteria listed for each award. However, the University cannot be held responsible for any errors or

omissions in the information that has been supplied and on which eligibility decisions are based. The University's decision on the interpretation of eligibility criteria is final and there is no right of appeal.

Subject or other specific eligibility criteria

Some scholarships may be withdrawn, or payments withheld, if you no longer meet the specific course requirements, specific grade progression criteria, or other conditions that may be attached to a particular award e.g., volunteering hours for the GSP.

An award will not be taken away if your general eligibility changes in any subsequent year e.g., if you have an increase in your household income.

Details of any continuation criteria you need to meet will be detailed in your award email, if successful. Decisions will be made at the discretion of the University and/or the scholarship provider.

Your responsibilities

You cannot be considered for an award if you have not responded to our invitations to apply, or if our Student Finance Team have not received your household income assessment from the SLC.

We cannot be held responsible for any delays in receiving your household income information from the SLC as a result of their assessment processes, or incomplete/late applications made to them.

Receiving more than one award

In order to ensure that we can provide financial support to as many students as possible, there may be restrictions on either the combination or number of awards that you can receive. Please see the below tables which illustrate the combinations of funding support that you may be able to receive.

How bursaries and scholarships are paid

Early payment of Bursary or Gold Scholarship

In your **first year of study only** you can receive £300 of your Bath Bursary or £500 of your Gold Scholarship as an early cash payment prior to starting studies at Bath. This is to help you with any initial start-up or technology costs when starting university.

In order to receive this early payment and to claim your bursary award you must have completed [registration online](#) and all administrative tasks associated with your confirmation of place to study at Bath.

Should you be successful in gaining a Bath Bursary or Gold Scholarship, you will be sent information in your award email (sent out from Friday 5th September 2026 onwards) on how to submit bank details. You must provide your bank details by 9am on Thursday 10th September 2026 in order to receive the early cash payment.

Payment of the £300 or £500 will be made on or around Thursday 17th September 2026. If you miss the deadline for the early payment, then this will be paid alongside your instalment in December.

[If you decide not to start studies at Bath](#)

If you have received the early payment of £300/£500 and you do not start your studies at Bath by Monday 28th September 2026, then the University will invoice you for repayment of these funds. The Student Finance Office will send out an invoice to you and these have a 14-day payment deadline.

[If you do not provide bank details](#)

If you have not responded to our request(s) to provide bank details via your Student SAMIS account within your first year of study, then we will assume that you do not wish to accept your award and consequently withdraw it. The Bath Bursary can be reinstated in subsequent years if you contact the [Scholarship and Bursaries Team](#). Any payments made will reflect the academic year your award is reinstated and onwards. You will not be paid any monies missed from previous academic years.

[Late awards](#)

If your Bath Bursary or Corporate Scholarship are awarded late within the academic year, you may miss a scheduled payment date. In this instance, the University **will pay cash payments on the next scheduled scholarship and bursary payment run**; details of which will be included within your award email.

The Accommodation Bursary or accommodation element of the Bath Bursary and Gold Scholarship Programme will not be paid if you become eligible past Friday 12th March 2027.

The campus credit element of the Bath Bursary and Gold Scholarship Programme will be paid pro-rata. Specifics of how much you can expect to receive will be included within your award email.

For the 2026/7 academic year, second year Scholars will be paid £750 on Wednesday 2nd December 2026 (subject to completing their compulsory commitments).

Payment schedule for the Accommodation Bursary

First year Bath Bursary or Gold Scholarship Programme recipients will receive the accommodation element of their awards either as an automatic reduction in university accommodation fees, or as cash, if you are living outside of university accommodation.

The standalone Accommodation Bursary will be deducted from either your January or April **university-managed accommodation fees**, depending on when we receive your household income assessment.

Alternative payment schedules

The payment schedule for students who become eligible for the Bath Bursary due to a [drop in household income](#) may differ to the above information.

Details of any alternative payment schedule will be included in your award email.

Gold Scholarship and Claverton Scholarship payment conditions

For recipients of the Gold Scholarship or Claverton Scholarship, we reserve the right to withhold scholarship payments if you are not on track to fulfil your programme requirements. Please refer to the individual Terms and Conditions for full details about the requirements of these awards.

Payment method

Cash payments will be made by direct bank transfer. Bank details will need to be provided through your student SAMIS account when requested, otherwise payment will be delayed. The deadline for providing bank details will be included in your award email. Changes to bank details can be made through your Student SAMIS account at any time but will need to be made **at least two weeks** before a payment date to take effect.

[Campus Credit](#) will be uploaded onto the [Bath Go app](#) for use in on-campus hospitality and retail outlets, with the exception of Fresh and SU outlets.

You must not share your Campus Credit QR code with your peers. If you do, the University is not responsible for any misused funds. Please contact the [Scholarship and Bursaries Team](#) should you suspect that someone has been using your Campus Credit.

Students in receipt of campus credit will also receive a 10% discount on purchases when paying at the till. Any unused credit will roll over year-to-year until you graduate, at which point, your account will be cleared. **There is no cash alternative.**

Please contact the [Scholarship and Bursaries Team](#) if you do not have access to a smart phone and are unable to download the Bath Go App.

Please contact the [Bath Go Support Team](#) if you have any technical difficulties with the Bath Go app.

Withdrawal from funding

You are within your rights to withdraw from university funding at any point during your time at Bath. Please contact the [Scholarship and Bursaries Team](#) if you would no longer like to receive financial support.

Placement Year

If you are in receipt of a Bath Bursary or Gold Scholarship, then your award will still be paid to you if your placement period is defined as **unpaid or study abroad** in SAMIS.

For courses that are defined as a thin placement course (e.g., Business or Architecture), the Bath Bursary or Gold Scholarship will be paid on a pro-rata basis across relevant paid placement periods. If you are on a thin placement course and **your placement period is unpaid**, you will receive your full funding for that academic year. You will also be entitled to the Placement Bursary which will be paid pro-rata across the relevant placement years.

If you are on a placement year that is split between half study abroad/unpaid placement period and half paid placement, then any bursary or scholarship entitlement will be paid on a pro-rata basis.

Please refer to the Placement Bursary [Terms and Conditions](#) for further information about placement years and the Placement Bursary.

Honours top up year

If you were in receipt of a bursary award and following graduation from a Foundation Degree, you continue immediately onto the Honours top up year, then you will continue to receive your bursary award as outlined in this document. If you take a gap year (e.g., whole academic year) before continuing onto the Honours year, then any award will be based on the funding in place for that academic year. Students on part-time Honours top up years will receive the award on a pro-rata basis.

Suspensions and withdrawal from studies

If you suspend or withdraw from study, you will not be eligible to receive any future award payments in that year. You must notify the [Scholarships and Bursaries Team](#) of your change in circumstances. If you are in receipt of a Corporate Scholarship, you must also notify the [Advancement Team](#) as it may affect your continued eligibility. Any funding already paid to you will not have to be repaid. Corporate Scholars will be paid any outstanding payments upon their return.

Bath Bursary and Gold Scholarship recipients

You will be paid all outstanding payments upon your return, with the exception of the accommodation reduction in Year 1.

Students that return to study part-way through the year will receive their cash payments on a pro-rata basis e.g.,

- A Bath Bursary recipient who returns at the start of January 2027 will receive £666.66 on the next scheduled cash payment date (Wednesday 10th February 2027). If you return after 27th January 2027, you will receive £333.33 on the next scheduled cash payment date (Wednesday 21st April 2027).
- A Gold scholar who returns at the start of January 2027 will receive £1,333.33 on Wednesday 10th February 2027 and £1,333.33 on Wednesday 21st April 2027. If you return after 27th January 2027, you will receive £1,333.33 on Wednesday 21st April 2027.

Repeating an academic year, changing course or deferring your studies

The Bath Bursary and Gold Scholarship will be paid automatically during a **single first-time repeat year**.

Bath Bursary

Bath Bursary recipients will receive £2,000 if repeating Year 1. This will consist of £1,000 cash and £1,000 Campus Credit.

Bath Bursary recipients who retake for a second year will have to provide written confirmation from the Student Loans Company (SLC) that their repeat year is being funded as a result of mitigating circumstances. A second repeat year will not be funded if the SLC have not provided this confirmation.

Gold Scholarship Programme

Gold Scholars will receive £5,000 if repeating Year 1. This will consist of £4,000 cash and £1,000 Campus Credit.

Part-time study arrangements

If you are studying a full-time course on a part-time basis e.g., when an academic year spans the course of two calendar years (upon agreement with your academic tutor), your university funding will be paid pro-rata to reflect this.

Overpayments

All payments will be calculated on a pro-rata basis and any overpayments may need to be repaid to the University should you receive such in error, suspend, withdraw from studies, transfer to a non-eligible programme or no longer be eligible for payments for any other reason (in such a case the University may seek to recover the amount of the overpayment as a debt in the county court).

Fraudulent applications

The University reserves the right to withdraw an award from anyone who is found to have misled the University about any aspect of their eligibility and to seek repayment of any monies already paid to them. The University may seek to recover any money paid as a debt in the county court, including the recovery of additional sums such as interest, court fees and legal costs.

Appeals

The University's decision on the interpretation of eligibility criteria is final and there is no right of appeal. You may make a complaint if you believe that you have not been considered for an award because of a procedural error, or you believe that there have been other procedural problems with our allocating and awarding system. Complaints should be made under the terms of our [Student Complaints Policy and Procedure](#). You must comply with all requests for

additional information to establish your eligibility within the timeframes specified and you must submit any evidence requested by the stated deadlines.

Data use and retention

The University may use contextual data / information you share with us to provide information and advice about the University to you as an applicant. Should you subsequently join the University, the University may also use and share the data with appropriate teams/departments around the University. This is to inform our strategies for supporting you as a new entrant, to inform you about provision that you may be able to access, to monitor student success and for other legitimate reasons. Please refer to our web pages for details about our undergraduate [privacy notice](#). Any contextual information we have for you may be stored for up to 6 years following graduation.

Other than your first and most recent household income import, all data imported from the Student Loans Company is archived annually. Your first and most recent household income may be stored for up to 6 years following graduation. The household income of students who do not enrol at Bath will only be used for financial forecasting, and will be archived the following academic year.

Data may be used by the [Study Abroad Office](#) in the allocation of any grants that may be available for students on study abroad placement courses. We may also use your data in the allocation of other bursaries and scholarships on offer in partnership with corporate donors or other University awards, where funding may be allocated based on household income or contextual data. Your actual contextual and household income data will not be shared with a third party but shortlisting/ selection for a scholarship may give an indication that you have met such factors.

We will share information given by you in your application to apply for any university scholarship with other teams within [Student Support and Safeguarding](#). This is so we can ensure that you are made aware of any support services that would enable you to succeed in your studies at Bath.

Student support at Bath

At Bath we understand that each student is unique and recognise individual differences. Coming to university is a new experience and while for many it is an exciting time full of opportunities, we appreciate some students may encounter uncertainties at some point during their studies.

As a scholarship recipient we want to ensure that you are aware of, and have access to, the right support and advice should you need it. If we have concerns about your well-being, we may discuss these on a one-to-one basis with the Wellbeing Team within Student Support and Safeguarding to seek their advice and ensure that you are signposted to relevant support as appropriate.

Donor funded scholarships and data

Donors who fund scholarships like to know who is benefitting from their support. The Advancement Office (AO) facilitates any interaction between you and your donor, such as asking you to write an introductory letter (required), arranging meetings, inviting you to events, and asking you to write an annual end-of-year report to share with your donor (required annually). You will be contacted by the AO who greatly appreciate your support in providing the requested information in a timely manner so that donors are kept informed of the impact of their donation. You will also receive a consent form for sharing photos and content. All communication will come from advancement@bath.ac.uk or from a member of the team directly.

The University may also give your donor some information about you based on your student record, information given by you in your scholarship application, subsequent annual exam results, as well any changes to your study, such as repeat years, suspending study, or course changes. This is always done in liaison with the AO.

The AO may provide you with information about your donor, as appropriate and where possible. By accepting your scholarship, you are agreeing to these terms.
