University of Bath funding package Up to £5,000 per year
Bursaries and scholarships available to eligible students. Vulnerable students are prioritised when applying for these bursaries. Childcare Grant Up to £298.69 per week depending on number of children
Parents' Learning Allowance Up to £1,766

Applying for government funding as a Refugee It is important to have your funding in place before starting a course at university. Apply early via the gov.uk website. Generally, applicants will be eligible for government funding if they have been granted Refugee status or Humanitarian Protection by the UK government, or they are the spouse/civil partner/child of a person with that status, and are ordinarily resident in the UK on the first day of the first academic year of your course. You may be eligible for government funding without Refugee/HP status, for example via Long Residence criteria. We recommend checking your eligibility for government funding via the UKCISA website. If you are not eligible for government funding then you will need to investigate other options such as scholarships. The STAR website is a good starting point.

Student Money Advice
