OUR CAMPUS AND CITY, AMBITION BUILT IN.

PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The DBA in Higher Education Management is a part-time research degree at doctoral level.

We bring together the latest scholarship and an applied focus on research. You'll develop a thorough understanding of how and why things happen in contemporary higher education.

As well as developing your leadership expertise, you'll graduate with research skills appropriate for higher educational managers, and be better equipped to deal with the ethical and political issues facing higher education today.

The course is designed for you to apply your knowledge to your work as you progress through the course. Applying your DBA research to your own organisation will allow you to:

- understand emerging trends in higher education
- improve national and international policy
- establish and share best practice in management and leadership

Course structure

We know how busy leaders are. We've designed our DBA to be flexible around your personal and professional demands. The DBA in Higher Education Management is more structured than a traditional PhD. It consists of two phases:

- 1 a two-year taught programme delivered through four residential sessions in Bath (eight days per residential session)
- 2 a DBA research thesis phase

Assessment

The taught phase is like a structured training programme to prepare you for your thesis. During this stage, you'll complete four assignments. The final assignment is a research proposal for your thesis.

We've designed each assignment to give you content-specific skills and other transferable skills. Completing all four assignments will give you the key building blocks you'll need to start your thesis.

To be eligible for the thesis phase you will need to complete and pass all four assignments.

YOUR APPLICATION

Admissions

Entry to the Bath DBA in Higher Education Management is competitive and we take a holistic view when evaluating candidates.

We take many factors into account when assessing applicants, including professional experience. We are looking for individuals with a strong record of achievement and ability, who are ready to make a significant contribution to both their cohort and their community.

Entry criteria

You must:

- be a university graduate or have a graduate level professional qualification
- hold a postgraduate or advanced graduate qualification in a field relevant to the programme
- have a minimum of three years' professional work experience with the potential to achieve significant organisational change within an organisation or the higher education sector in general
- have two good references - one should be academic (if you have studied in the last five years) and the other professional
- include a statement detailing your motivation for applying and your research interest

The programme begins in November each year. Places are limited and early application is advised.

As Head of the Library Information Systems Department at the Notre Dame University-Louaize, Lebanon, I needed a doctoral programme that would suit my busy work schedule and life commitments. That's how I ended up choosing the Bath DBA in Higher Education Management.

A unique programme

Given its record of excellence in management studies, the Bath DBA stood out because of its specialisation in Higher Education Management. The DBA involves researching issues at our own institutions. This is what makes this DBA unique. You will learn the latest theory and put it into practice outside of the course. Another great aspect of the course is that after only a year of study I've been able to apply it to my work already.

Sharing experiences at the residentials

My favourite part of the course has definitely been the residentials. Around 20 students from all over the world meet in Bath for a week, twice a year. My coursemates come from over ten different countries.

The residentials play a major part in bringing us closer together and developing a strong global network. Getting to know how each person thinks about a certain problem and approaches a solution has added a lot to my experience and broadened my knowledge.

The residentials also include different sessions on doctoral writing skills. These help us to develop our academic writing skills, preparing us for writing our thesis.

Another great thing about the residentials is the support we receive from the administrative and academic staff. The team is always available to answer any questions and help us through any issues. Feedback is encouraged during the residentials, and our comments and suggestions are taken into consideration.

There may be occasions where due to unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances it becomes necessary to make significant changes to a course or to withdraw it or part of it, for example a particular unit/module. Such action could become necessary if for example the following were to occur:

- a key member of staff leaves the University and we are unable to find a suitable replacement (e.g. with the requisite academic knowledge/experience)
- a professional body or regulator/accreditor requires changes to be made to a course or withdraws their accreditation of a course
- changes have to be made to reflect legislative changes/requirements
- changes have to be made to reflect changes in standards set by relevant regulators and/or in keeping with best practice or developments related to the particular discipline/subject area
- student feedback clearly indicates that immediate changes be made to a course or unit
- unexpected low recruitment to a course or unit/module means it is simply no longer viable or practical to run it.
