## BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE CAREER OF CAROL BRYANT

Carol Bryant was educated at Channing School, Highgate, London, and Anstey College of Physical Education, Birmingham, UK. She was a member of the Barnet Ladies' Hockey Club and the Highgate Ladies' Hockey Club. She went on to play for the county team of Hertfordshire from 1957, and for the East territorial team from 1959, before representing the England 'B' and touring teams. She was selected for the full international team in 1964 first as left inner and later as centre half. Carol also served as an umpire.

A specialist Physical Education (PE) teacher, she coached hockey in the USA as well as widely within the UK. In 1966, having previously worked at Northwood College, London and Channing School, she became head of the Physical Education Department at Chelmsford County High School for Girls, Chelmsford, Essex, UK.

In her book, *Hockey for Schools*, published in 1969, Carol wrote; 'The foundations of success in hockey are invariably laid in schools'. Her touring experience and hockey-related travel afforded opportunities to observe the various styles of hockey played around the world, prompting a keen interest in teaching and coaching techniques. Evidence of Carol's great love and enthusiasm for the sport, *Hockey for Schools* provided a practical, instructional guide of value to all those interested in building success and improving the standard of play.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the contents list. It covers the period from 1956 to 1970.

The collection is very small. It comprises various materials assembled by Carol Bryant relating to her career as a member of the England hockey team during the 1960s and includes scrapbooks and memorabilia documenting international tours to South Africa and the USA.

Although Carol Bryant had been a member of the England touring team since 1961, 1964 was the first time that she was selected to play for the national team's home matches.

This section contains three scrapbooks compiled by Carol Bryant during the 1960s. They relate mainly to her career as an international hockey player and member of the All England Women's Hockey Association national touring team, documenting visits to South Africa and the USA as well as matches and tournaments in the UK.

The presentation is chronological.
