Flexible learning

The delivery of our campus-based courses is mainly through in-person activities on campus, supported by online elements and structured independent study.

In addition, our online teaching includes both live, interactive learning sessions – allowing sharing and exploration of ideas within a group – and structured independent self-study.

- employability developing your interview techniques, presenting with impact, making your CV and job applications stand out, and developing a range of soft skills such as team working, problem solving, and effective networking
- language skills learning or improving a foreign language (we offer eight languages at different levels) and developing intercultural and communication skills to support your employability

If you plan to progress to doctoral study, getting involved in research as part of your master's can prepare you for this and help your application.


You'll also be able to meet current doctoral research students during your master's studies, either in the postgraduate-only study spaces or as part of your course, as they're often involved in teaching.

Developing a sustainable alternative to palm oil

How a yeast fed on waste could take a seat at the dinner table – and curb deforestation.

We're developing the world's first portable device that detects synthetic drugs.



"My lectures are really fun, entertaining, and interactive, and we do a lot of activities in the class itself. Since our student group is really small, the lecturer-to-student ratio is good. I have a great relationship with my Director of Studies. She knows us all well and she knows our strengths. She's my supervisor for my dissertation as well, so it's helpful that my project aligns with her area of study.

The units I've studied here focus a lot on teamwork to help students go into the industry after the course. This is useful as employers look for teamwork experience on your CV. It teaches us transferable skills as well, like presentation skills and time management, which you'll require all throughout your professional life.

If you're working in a group, you can ask each other for help and share what you're planning for your coursework. Of course, if you have any doubts, you can always reach out to the lecturers. Everybody is very approachable here. I don't remember finding anybody on my course who wasn't supportive when I asked for help, so I make sure to be the same when people approach me too."

Improve your employability with a new language

Learning a language can develop your intercultural awareness and increase your chances of being employed across the world and in international businesses.

Through our Skills Centre, you can choose to learn a new language or work on your existing skills. We offer classes in eight languages at different levels and, if English isn't your first language, you can join our weekly English language classes.

You can also make the most of our international community through our Virtual Exchange and Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) programmes which give you opportunities to develop your language skills with other students in a friendly, informal way.

Working in the UK

If you're an international student and want to stay in the UK after your studies, you'll be able to apply for a Graduate route visa.

If you complete your master's degree, you'll then be able to work or look for work in the UK for up to two years after you graduate. If you complete a PhD or other doctoral qualification, you'll be able to stay to work or look for work for up to three years after you graduate.

If you are then offered a job that meets the Skilled Worker criteria, you can switch to this route. This visa can last for up to 5 years.

"My advice to a new student is to use the Careers Service resources as much as possible. I know many students may be busy with their lectures and coursework, but I think it's useful to spend some time reflecting on yourself and finding out what kind of job you want.

I booked a meeting with the School of Management Careers Officer. They make different suggestions based on each person's progress. I did some mock interviews with them because I'd found it hard to show my abilities in interviews before. It was good practice for me, and the officer told me to reflect on my past experience to find links with the role and present my story in a logical way.

My Student Experience Officer also gave me some very useful advice about questions that might be in a job interview. They said I might be asked to show teamwork ability, data analysis skills, and problem solving. It's helped me to be more organised for my next interview.

Bath is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, both as one of the Great Spas of Europe and for its Roman heritage and Georgian architecture.

As a student here, you can immerse yourself in Bath's history and beauty by visiting the famous Roman Baths and admiring the grand 18th century buildings.

When you want to go out for a meal with friends, Bath has plenty of restaurants and cafés to choose from, many of which offer student discounts. You'll find lots of well-known chains in the city, as well as independent places offering a variety of cuisines, including European, Chinese, Indian, Thai, and halal dishes.

If you're looking for bars, pubs, and clubs, there's a great selection, ranging from cosy and quiet to late-night and noisy.

Bath has three cinemas and three theatres, including the Theatre Royal where you can watch West End plays.

A unique destination for shopping

Bath has an exciting mix of luxury, high-street, and independent shops, so you should always be able to find what you're looking for. You can browse for well-known brands or explore the picturesque alleyways and side streets for artisan gems. There are also regular markets and popups, run by local traders, for a one-of-a-kind shopping experience.

There are three large supermarkets in the city centre and numerous international food shops in the local area that sell African, Asian, Caribbean, Indian, Mediterranean, Middle-Eastern and Polish goods.

Enjoy the outdoors

There are lots of outdoor spaces to relax in the city, including squares with kerbside cafés and leafy parks and gardens.

If you like to stay active, the city and surrounding countryside are perfect for walking, running, and cycling, with access to National Cycle Network routes to help you explore the area with friends.

There are also places to go swimming, both indoors and in the wild, as well as Cleveland Pools, Britain's oldest lido, which is due to reopen in 2022. If you prefer to stay dry on the water, you can hire a rowing boat, paddleboard, canoe, or punt on the River Avon.

Art and culture

While studying at Bath, you and your friends can immerse yourselves in arts and culture in the city. There are lots of museums, galleries, and historic sites to explore, including the ancient Roman Baths and Georgian streets filled with stunning architecture.





Open to innovation

There's a thriving local economy in Bath, giving you a wide range of employment opportunities with leading organisations across different industries.

Living in Bath also gives you the chance to go to industry events, like Bath Digital Festival, where you can meet potential employers and make contacts for the future.



Protecting our environment

Our community is committed to researching ways to reduce the effects of climate change. We're also improving our sustainability and reducing the impact our systems, staff, and students have on the environment.

Our Climate Action Framework

Between 2005 and 2020, even as we've developed our campus facilities and infrastructure, our carbon emissions fell by 45%. In 2020, we set out our eleven Climate Action Framework principles. These are our commitments to further address the climate emergency. They include targets to:

- achieve Net Zero in University vehicle emissions, refrigerant losses, heating, and electricity by 2030
- halve emissions from purchased goods, services, waste, and all travel by 2030, with full Net Zero by 2040
- develop our curriculum over the coming years to create opportunities for every student to study and work on climate-related issues

Education for change

We were the first university to include Carbon Literacy in our induction for all new students. This means you can gain accreditation with the Carbon Literacy Project by making climate action pledges to achieve meaningful change.

You can take part in Vertically Integrated Projects to work with local councils and organisations, locally and globally, on real-world sustainability challenges. You can also get involved in our Climate Action work. For example, in 2021 and 2022, students helped create principles for climate-aligned research and education at the University.

Research for change

Many of our researchers are looking at the impacts of climate change and investigating ways to reduce emissions and protect the environment. We have several research institutes and centres dedicated to this, including:

- The Centre for Climate Change and Social Transformations
- The Centre for Sustainable and Circular Technologies
- The Institute for Advanced Automotive
 Propulsion Systems
- The Institute for Sustainable Energy and the Environment

Our environmental research includes:

Collaborating with other universities

We're a member of the COP26 Universities Network, a growing group of more than 40 UK based universities working together to provide the government with academic expertise on climate issues. The Network has been meeting since 2019 to discuss and agree on the plans for our contributions to a low-carbon world.

We're a part of The Alliance for Sustainability Leadership in Education (EAUC). We work with colleges and universities across the UK and Ireland to make higher education as sustainable as it can be.

We are also members of the GW4 Climate Alliance, collaborating together with the Universities of Bristol, Cardiff and Exeter through research, education, and professional services to reduce our climate impacts.

Generating our own power

Our Combined Heat and Power plants on campus are over two times more efficient than a standard power station. During a typical year, they generate enough electricity to power 540 houses.

These mini 'power stations' also recycle their waste heat on-site, which keeps our Olympic-sized swimming pool warm and creates hot water for showers.

We also have five large sets of solar panels on our buildings, with more to come, and the rest of our electricity comes from zero carbon sources.



Reducing our waste

Our students and staff are actively involved in helping to reduce waste on campus. As a student at Bath, you can help by:

- bringing your own reusable cup when you buy drinks on campus, which saves you 20p on all takeaway drinks
- borrowing and returning a reusable cup at our cafés instead of buying a disposable one
- buying discounted food through our Munch Box scheme, which saves surplus food from being thrown away

At the end of each term, you can take part in the Pack for Good campaign and donate unwanted things to charity when you move out of your accommodation.

In 2021, we donated nearly 19 tonnes of secondhand clothes, utensils, electronic equipment, and books to the British Heart Foundation through the campaign, raising an estimated Bath city total of \pounds 32,000 for the charity. Since the campaign began in 2012, we've raised a total of \pounds 554,000 through charity donations.

"I completed my undergraduate degree in maths, and I was lined up to do a research master's in statistics in healthcare and transgender issues. When the pandemic started, my plans changed, and I decided to apply to Bath to study the MA in Gender and Politics.

Through the numerous national lockdowns at this time, I found that my mental health wasn't in a great place. My student finance got messed up from the year before and I had some issues relating to my disabled students' allowance. After speaking with some of the staff at the University of Bath, they were able to help me by doing a mini-assessment and determined that they felt I would be able to get an allowance. Through them, I was able to get it sorted. Throughout the whole experience I felt very supported, and at no point did I feel like I was dealing with my student finance problems by myself.

Before starting the course, I was a bit anxious as, although I'd had a lot of experience writing policy documents for the NHS, I hadn't as much experience with writing academic essays as my background was in another subject. The staff at the University were really reassuring and they told me about courses on essay writing, skills workshops, and wellbeing sessions that were available to students." "Throughout the whole experience I felt very supported, and at no point did I feel like I was dealing with problems by myself." "I was worried my experience wouldn't be enough for such a technical degree. The Director of Studies was kind enough to answer my concerns and reassure me that my professional experience was more than enough."

If you defer your entry, you'll pay the fees for the year you start your course. These fees may be more than 5% higher than the previous year.

Your fee status
